Reflections by Pastor Craig

What's the rush? Seriously, what is the big hurry? As the season warms, I am getting in longer bike rides and venturing out on the local roadways and it confirms what I have been pondering for a while now, everyone seems to be in a hurry as we travel from one place to the next. I see many things when riding and it often gives me pause to think, why do people (myself included) need to get from one place to another so quickly? Is destination that important? Are we that important that we travel with destination on our minds rather than taking the effort to slow the pace, take notice of what is around us and perhaps enjoy the journey? I know I am often viewed as an inconvenience when I share the road for I have been honked at, waved at (not the hello, glad to see you, kind of wave), ignored (passed with no regard for the three foot law), or what I call "gassed" which is when drivers rapidly accelerate after passing and thereby leaving a poof of unburned gas exhausted for my next breath. In truth, I do not believe many of these experiences are planned and purposeful but simply reactions to circumstances that challenges one's belief that we somehow own the road or space that we occupy.

With cell phone technology, our automobiles have become extended offices and opportunities to check on family members and friends. People are listening to music and podcasts while out for a morning or evening run, hike or bike ride. It has occurred to me that as a whole, people are becoming selective with human connections and instant availability has lessened our practice of patience. I do not believe we intentionally ignore one another or willingly choose not to notice or care. I just think we are focused and have task on the brain which literally drives our lives with little or sometimes even no thought to other possibilities.

In this season of Easter, there are stories that relate to people who are also set on a mission, running and hurrying about. On first read, it might seem the reason has to do with schedules or appointments. But in reality, it has less to do with getting to work, or accomplishing a task for there were no appointments to keep. No timed commitments. No soccer games, meetings, work hours to manage (sounds refreshing). No, the pace was quickened in response to the excitement to share news that what seemed like an ending was actually a new beginning. What seemed to be the death and end of Jesus was actually the fulfillment of resurrection promise and that kind of news is so worth telling that people were eager to run to the tomb, run back to Jerusalem, dive into the water to hurry and meet the resurrected Lord.

How does that reality change our view of the world around us? How does that knowledge influence our hurried pace and cause us to zoom out to pan the world around us and begin to see others not as inconveniences but as opportunities to share in life and to learn from one another and find ways of sharing in the good news message of the resurrected Jesus and his hope for the world? Life has a way of slowing us down and awakening our awareness: illness, injury, loss of job, family transitions, natural crisis, change in job responsibility, impending death, or a simple flat tire or failed alarm. We face many opportunities as reminders that our lives and our time are, in reality, not ours at all but, are gifts entrusted to us by God for a time, and the best we can do is apply and care for the relationships, opportunities, resources as best we can so that we live out our days in ways that are meaningful, fulfilling and grateful for what we have. There is indeed good news in that and I am eager to share that with others. How about you? Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
