## THE FESTIVAL OF ALL SAINTS

"Build from the Heart" is a project that will benefit the Teeters family who are members of Saint Andrew. Chris and Annie's children, Zak, 5, Callie, 18 months, are the only two children in the world known to have a Chromosome 3 and 6 abnormality, which causes delays with their cognitive and physical development.

The challenges the family face makes it difficult to navigate through their own home or to find support groups in their area. In an effort to help the Teeters and provide much needed resources for other special needs families in the Central Wisconsin area, River Valley Bank and Channel 9 have teamed up to spearhead this community effort. The "Build from the Heart" project includes building a new handicap accessible home for the Teeters, which will offer a Community Room for other special needs families to utilize for playgroups, therapy and networking.
