GOOD STEWARDS

As we move into 2011 and finalize plans for a budget to fund the next year's ministries, it remains challenging to determine accurate intentions through confirmed pledges. While pledges that have been received to date have been both generous and supportive, there yet remains a significant number of pledges that were included in last year's totals but have yet to be confirmed for 2011. These pledge numbers translate as 137 households for a total of \$94,000. This is a significant shortfall over last year's budget. If you have not yet responded with your pledge of support, please do so. At this time, in addition to reductions in funding for ministries, all salaries and wages of staff will be offered with no increases over last year as well as several reductions of hours for many staff members for the 2011 calendar year. These are not the kinds of decisions that are desired as we continue to experience growth in membership. With uncertain financial support, it will be necessary to find new ways to meet current ministry needs and plan for future needs as well. Your prayerful support is needed as we seek God's guidance though challenging times.
