PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

It isn't as easy as fulfilling the law. It isn't as easy as doing the right difficult than that. In his sermon to the disciples and the crowd, Jesus describes the life of faith from a different perspective. The "law says" (yes, we know what the law says) "but I say...be perfect, therefore as your heavenly Father is perfect." (It would be easier to obey the law.) We know about vengeance and retaliation as natural responses to injustice and unfairness. We can relate to the "eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth" image of justice. Jesus calls for a radically different response. Do not repay evil with more evil. Love enemies. Pray for those who persecute. (No, I'd rather rule with an iron fist and respond to others in so much as they respond to me.) Jesus declares a better way—a godly way.

The perfection God defines is to love neighbor as self. Love enemies, pray for those who persecute. But this is not possible as long as we see one another through the lens of suspicion, jealousy, anger or resentment. It is not possible to fulfill such a tall order on our own. It is too difficult. It is impossible! But there is a better way. Jesus fulfills for us what we are unable to fulfill on our own. Through the perfect love of Jesus, we can love the unlovable. We can pray for those who trouble us. Let God play the part of prosecutor and judge. These are positions we are not very good at. Sin clouds our perspective. There is a better way. The way of the cross. The way of Jesus. The way of grace. Divine grace.

GOOD STEWARDS

S oon you will receive a mailing that will define the 2011 Lenten theme. Continuing the example of the Stewardship Ministry, the theme will be based on Stewardship. The five weeks between Ash Wednesday (March 9) and Holy Week will help focus how we are stewards of *Trust*, *Time*, *Talent*, *Treasure* and *Mission*. Experience has taught that people will support an event, an organization, or a plan if there is trust and clarity of expectations and if people are invited to participate. Being good stewards of time and talent will go a long way toward support and participation. This focus will help raise awareness of the many ways we are called upon to be faithful stewards of the resources God has entrusted to our care.

Once again, a Lenten token will be available during Lent to help support the theme. A suggested donation of \$1 will cover the cost of these tokens without adding a further expense to the budget. Thank you.
