PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

ver the course of forty days, the life of the church draws us into the depths of the valley making us long for what Christ alone can provide—life. Spring is upon us and with the arrival of spring come signs of life poking up from the ground. We have a ways yet to go before the full expression of life is revealed but we are getting closer. We have a ways to go in the season of Lent but we are getting closer to the day when our "alleluias" will return and we celebrate fully the hope that bursts forth through the Easter message. This week the readings will set the stage for the final week of Lent—Holy Week. We will celebrate the triumphal entry of our Lord into Jerusalem and little by little we will experience the depth of Christ's passion, his betrayal and eventual abandonment by all who loved him. Such it is with us as well. Our best efforts cannot prevent the brokenness of life from taking us over and we too fall away like sheep that are scattered by wolves.

Maundy Thursday worship is the start of the holy three days that conclude our Lenten journey. Services for both Thursday and Friday are continuous and spill even into Holy Saturday leaving us anxiously awaiting the dawn of Easter morning. The difference for us from those who first went to the tomb is that we know what to expect. We know that we can expect joyful music, alleluia proclamations and the affirming statement that "Christ is Risen!" We know the truth about what others had only visions of hope and expectation. Did Jesus really mean what he said? Could it indeed be that there is such a thing as life after death? We know how the story ends. We know that Christ rose victorious and that this is no small thing. Christ died and rose to life so that we can live in the blessed assurance of that same promise. The story of Christ is rooted in the cross which not only represents death, but also life, new life. May the blessings of the Easter promise be revealed anew so that we remember that Christ is Risen. He is risen indeed! Alleluia! - Paster Craiq
