## PASTORAL REFLECTIONS—*Pastor Craig*



A mailing will soon arrive to assist you in contemplating what kind of response is faithful for you as you renew your financial commitment of support for another year of ministry in Christ's Church through Saint Andrew.

Because of generous general giving as well as additional giving in the Freed for Mission/Grow With God/Building Debt Reduction effort, we are in a much better place this fall than we were just one year ago. Even with continued challenges, there is still much for which to give thanks and many opportunities to practice good stewardship in our homes, communities and the church.

I recently attended a synod sponsored stewardship event at Saint Andrew where the speaker, Chick Lane, reminded us of the biblical passage, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Mathew 6:21; Luke 12:34) He said it is also true that "where your money goes will cause your heart to go there as well." A proactive and practical application is spelled out in a book called, *Giving to God* by Mark Allen Powell. "Put more of your money where you want Jesus to work and your heart will go there as well." So, where is your money going and how is Jesus blessing your efforts for the sake of the gospel?

As we enter the fall and reflect back on the months behind and anticipate the year to come, it is a good time to pause to give thanks but also to break out scratch paper and pencil and calculate how you intend to share what God provides. Will you use a proportion model? Lump sum? Will your giving increase for the next year or do you feel the need to adjust and give less at this time? No matter what your response, know that your participation and support is valued and received with gratitude. Being a good steward is not a matter of meeting a budget but of searching the heart to grow in our relationship with God and with one another.

When the Commitment mailing arrives please take the time to ask the question, "How might Jesus use what I share to support efforts to transform lives?" Then, make your response knowing that you have given faithful consideration and are offering gladly from what God has entrusted you to manage and to share.

## WAUSAU EMPTY BOWLS PROJECT IS BACK! *Saturday, October 22, 11 am –2 pm*

Empty Bowls is an international grassroots effort to fight hunger and was created by The Imagine Render Group. The basic premise is simple: Potters and other craftspeople, educators and others work with the community to create handcrafted bowls. Guests are invited to a simple meal of soup and bread. In exchange for a cash donation, guests are asked to keep a bowl as a reminder of all the empty bowls in the world. The money raised is donated to an organization working to end hunger and food insecurity.

Bowl-making will be offered *Tuesday, October 4, 1-3 pm or 5:30-7 pm at Saint Andrew with the fund raising event taking place at The Rose Garden in Wausau.* Sign up in the Fellowship Hall or call the church office to participate in these workshops-no experience necessary! *Proceeds of the event will benefit The Neighbor's Place Food Pantry.*

Materials to bring: color comic pages, colorful magazine pages, odd and ends of colorful wrapping paper, paper doilies, and even scraps of colorful fabrics.
