PASTORAL REFLECTIONS — Pastor Craig

⁴⁴F or everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." These are words recorded in the book Ecclesiastes and are commonly read at funerals. "A time to live, and a time to die." But for me, the words are a reminder of the predictable pattern of season changes. The shifting of the earth's proximity to the sun and the accompanying orbit of the earth's moon highlight the changes of Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. We are entering the fallow season when in this part of the country especially, the earth sleeps and takes a break from planting, growing and harvesting. Winter's rest is drawing near and the daylight hours are growing shorter while the length of darkness increases. For some people, it is a time to escape to a warmer climate and draw closer to the warmth of the sun.

At this same time, there is a change of seasons in the liturgical calendar of the church. November 27 marks the first week of Advent – the four week season prior to Christmas. Through this season, we prepare to celebrate once again the birth of Christ, God's greatest gift to the world. While holiday planning moves us to celebrate Christmas early with Christmas parties and programs, decorating and family gatherings, the message of the church holds us back so that we look back to a time long before the birth of Jesus and the proclamation of the prophets who foretold the coming of God's Messiah 800 years earlier. "A shoot shall come from the stump of Jesse." These words were written to a people whose hope was fading fast. They needed reassurance of God's promise of a Messiah to

be fulfilled. The challenges of oppression, enslavement and even death were all around them. Outside forces were banning together to attempt to crush their hopes and vision for the future.

Advent is a season of hope and new beginnings. It is a season that prepares us to celebrate anew the ongoing revelation of Christ's coming into our heats and lives to restore hope and life among us yet in our seasons and in our time. What does the season of your life look like? Are you in a season of waiting and longing for light to come? Is your season one of hopeful anticipation or one of despair? Are you in a season of transition? The Advent season is one of new beginnings. We dare not allow it to pass un-noticed and left unprepared for its rich message of hope and gratitude for what God is doing among us.

Isaiah calls us all to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice

GOOD STEWARDS (by the numbers)

As with any year, the pledged giving amounts never fully reflect budget predictions, however, history has shown that some things are reflective of patterns that give guidance with a good degree of accuracy. To date, the report shows 328 of 922 pledges possible have been returned (35.6%) for a Total Pledged amount of \$478,797.00. This amount is nearly 64% of the anticipated budget. Currently 110 families give regularly through automated giving (TOE).

Additionally, there are 90 families who did not pledge but who contributed support and it is anticipated will do so again. All this data reflects an intentional commitment of \$673,360.96 which is nearly 90% of the anticipated budget for 2012 with support of 57% of potential givers. Thank you to all who have responded with generous intents. It is exciting to consider future ministry opportunities as support comes through both pledged and unpledged commitments on behalf of the mission of Christ's church through Saint Andrew. Thank you!
