## PASTORAL REFLECTIONS ON CHRISTMAS – Pastor Craig & Pastor John

Seeing is believing. At least that's what many people think. Thomas, one of the twelve, doubted the news when he was not present to see the resurrected Jesus. "Unless I *see*, I will not believe."

In John's gospel, Philip invited Nathaniel to believe that the Messiah had come and was calling disciples to follow him. "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Can anything good come out of Nazareth?, Nathaniel asked. "Come and **see**."

In response to the angelic visit in the fields, shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and *see* this thing that the Lord has made known to us." Joseph, a descendant of David had come to Bethlehem from Nazareth where the virgin to whom he was engaged gave birth to a son, wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger.

The prophet Isaiah declares the promise of God with words that are assuring and comforting, "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." These words are preface to the gospel story from Luke on Christmas Eve. The connection between the prophets who announce God's plan of good news and the words of the angel to the shepherds echo in our hearts as we learn of good news of great joy for all people. "To you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior who is Christ the Lord." These are not only hope-filled words, they are words that speak of fulfillment of a promise, God's promise, an everlasting promise that God will provide a Savior who will bring peace for the sake of the world. The message of these words are just as encouraging in our time as they were to those who heard the news for the first time. Once again, you are invited to open your heart to the news of the birth of a Savior who brings good news for us to see. Will the news of Jesus born for you cause you to believe and cause you to praise God for all you have heard and seen as told to you? To you is born, a Savior! Rejoice! Christ is born, for you! We share this exciting news with the prophets, the shepherds, the disciples and all whose lives are touched by the love of Jesus. May the good news of Jesus be renewed in your hearts and lives and may your response cause others to *see* what God in Christ is doing among us.

Together, we wish each of you a very blessed Christmas and a new year filled with opportunities of telling and sharing God's love through the Savior, Christ the Lord!

## **GOOD STEWARDS**—Learn from the Geese (from the book entitled Generous Givers by Eugene Grimm)

**Fact:** As a goose flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71 percent more flying range than if each bird flew alone.

**Lesson:** Christian people share a common direction and sense of community. Churches can get where they are going more quickly and easily if they travel upon the thrust of one another.

Fact: The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Lesson: We need to make sure that our "honking from behind" is encouraging rather than critical.

**Application:** The gifts of God's people are best reflected when shared in common with the blessings of others. 
## CHRISTMAS AND SUNDAY OFFERINGS
