## PASTORAL REFLECTIONS — Pastor Craig

When the calendar turns to February this year, the thoughts of the church turn toward Lent. The whole Lenten season is based upon the date of Easter which is a moveable date determined by a formula related to the first full moon after March 21 (the first day of Spring). Easter is April 8 this year which means that Lent begins this year with Ash Wednesday on February 22. Each year a theme is chosen to guide our journey through this 40 day season. This year's theme will center on one of the portions of the Small Catechism, the Lord's Prayer. Evening Prayer will be used as the order of worship while a dialogue message will break the prayer into sections to process this prayer which Jesus gave as a model prayer to his disciples. The insert inside this issue of the Network highlights the weekly themes and dates. Lent is always a busy time in the life of Saint Andrew as times of worship, fellowship and growth in both faith and community. Please mark your calendars for this season and plan to participate in food preparation, serving or clean-up gathered around a time of worship and reflection.

Confirmation classes for grades 6 through 8 conclude on February 15. Students are encouraged to participate in the mid-week meals and worship services as part of the confirmation instruction process. First Communion Classes (fifth grade students and older) will meet on Sundays, March 3, 11 and 18 at 2 pm with a special worship service offered on Palm Sunday, April 1 at 2 pm. Information will be mailed soon to families with students in this age range in hopes that all will attend. ## THE LORD'S PRAYER

Prayer is the opening of one's heart and soul in a conversation with God, and thus is an expression of faith in a relationship with God.



When Jesus was approached by one of his disciples with a request to teach them to pray he said, "Then this is how you should pray" — the Lord's Prayer.

The Lord's Prayer (also called in Latin "Pater Noster" or "Our Father") occurs in both MATTHEW 6:9-13 and LUKE 11:2-4.

The Lord's Prayer is divided into an "Introduction" followed by "Seven Petitions" and ends with the "Conclusion".

# **LENTEN LITURGY** *Evening Prayer*

The liturgy for our Lenten services will be *Evening Prayer* which is traditionally used during the midweek services of Lent. *Evening Prayer* centers on the themes of light, repentance and recollection, quiet waiting for the Lord, meditation on Scripture, praise and thanksgiving, and intercessory prayer.

A lighted candle is the principal focus of attention in **Evening Prayer** for it represents Christ — "Jesus Christ is the Light of the World, that no darkness can overcome."

Sundays are not included in the 40 -day count because every Sunday is a celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord.

enten practices are shaped by have been important observances since Biblical times. Moses fasted and prayed for 40 days. During this time God gave him the Ten Commandments (Ex.34:27-28). Elijah fled for his life through the wilderness, fasting 40 days and nights until he came to Mt. Horeb. There God appeared and instructed him on how to overcome his enemies (First Kings 19:1-18). And, after Jesus was baptized, he withdrew to the desert to fast and pray for 40 days before beginning his public ministry (Mark 1:12).

opening phrases of the *Lord's Prayer*.
