Pastoral Reflections on the 31st Annual Meeting of Saint Andrew

S aint Andrew began with a charter membership of some 250 baptized people 31 years ago. We are now a congregation of nearly 3000 baptized members. Over the past 31 years 1,400 persons have been baptized; almost 850 persons have confirmed their faith in Jesus Christ; almost 500 couples have been united in marriage; and, some 200 persons have moved from the "Church Militant" to the "Church Triumphant" because "Christ is Risen."

For 31 years the congregation has gathered weekly



together to encounter God's Word, to share a meal at the Lord's Table, and be sent into the world to serve. People of all ages have been nurtured in faith and inspired to live as followers of Jesus Christ.

Because each person has been marked by the sign of the cross in baptism — we

pray, we prepare, we teach, and we invite others to follow and emulate the life of Christ. Throughout the congregation our ministries of service are different and varied but our purpose is the same: to touch the lives of others with God's surprising grace.

Through your support, both then and now, gifts of time, talents, and treasures have been shared and given out of gratitude to God for all that God has given each of us. The mission and ministry of Saint Andrew has been sustained in the past and the present both here and beyond ourselves.

The 31st Annual Meeting of Saint Andrew will provide a glimpse of some of the ways the congregation has brought to life the mission and ministry of Saint Andrew during this past year as well as plans for our ministry together during the upcoming year and future.

"Christian Stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities, and material possessions, based upon the conviction that these are trusts from God to be used in God's service for the benefit of all humankind in grateful acknowledgement of Christ's redeeming love." - a statement of the National Council of Churches United Stewardship Council in 1946.

As winter months fade, plans are being made for summer camp opportunities.

Crossways youth camp programs are designed to give campers an opportunity to experience all of the camp favorites while learning about our incredibly awesome God. Games, Worship, swimming, crafts, nature, and campfires are just some of the activities.

Saint Andrew is encouraging at least two camp opportunities this year. Other camp opportunities are also available for families and can be found by visiting the Crossways website. CrosswaysCamps.org Camp brochures are available on the table in the Narthex at Saint Andrew.

The first scheduled group opportunity for Saint Andrew families is Confirmation Camp, June 17-22. This is an annually scheduled event that is part of the Saint Andrew Confirmation Program. Families with students finishing 7th grade should have recently received a letter with details about how to register for the early discounts. If you did not receive a letter but wish to participate, please contact the Saint Andrew church office.

Confirmation Camp students are expected to pay half the cost of the camp (\$175). The remainder of the cost is paid for through the Saint Andrew Christian Education Budget.

The second opportunity is for high school youth not attending the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans yet want some kind of summer experience to enjoy a one-week faith nurturing experience; July 15-20. At the same time, a camp experience is planned for children who are completing grades 3 and 4 to sample the camp for three nights and four days. Registration materials are soon to be available.

Not for all camp experiences:

Crossways strives to make camp attendance affordable to everyone regardless of ability to pay. Financial assistance is available through Crossways for those who would not otherwise be able to attend camp. These funds are made possible by generous individuals, congregations, and groups who contribute to our Campership Fund.

Mark your calendars for February 26 when a representative from Crossways will be present to share more about what the summer has in store. All are encouraged and welcome to attend beginning at 9:15 am in the sanctuary.
