# PASTORAL REFLECTIONS—Pastor Craig

The following is an excerpt from the introduction of a book entitled *Loving Jesus* by Mark Allan Powell. Powell is professor of New Testament at Trinity Seminary in Columbus, Ohio and author of several books & helpful resources.

The Christian faith is not just a religion (a system of rituals and beliefs), but a relationship-a relationship of love with Jesus Christ who is risen from the dead. When Christianity is not first and foremost, a relationship of love, it becomes a matter of works and toil and patient endurance-all worthwhile perhaps, but a far cry from the spiritual experience of joy and peace that it is supposed to be.

You and I are named & claimed by Jesus through the waters of baptism. Baptism is our identity in Christ and therefore we are already in a loving relationship with Jesus for he initiated that relationship on our behalf. If for no other reason, baptism compels us to respond to that gift of grace and mercy by loving God and loving one another. This, Jesus said, is how we fulfill the Commandments, nurture loving relationships with God and with one another. This kind of living brings about joy and peace that is deeper than human emotions and is rooted in who we are. The voices and images of the world often do more to cloud our identity than clarify it. We ride the roller coaster of life from highs when things are going "our way" to the lows when life seems to be falling part around us. A better pattern is to focus on the Lenten Gospel Acclamation "Return to the Lord your God who is gracious & merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." This verse reminds us of our need to return to the one in whose name we gather and whose name we bear. At times we may come across as unloving and even unlovable, but thankfully, the forgiving presence of Christ proclaimed and offered weekly can allow us to see ourselves and each other with a new perspective and learn to love anew.

Loving God is at the heart of worship. The core of worship is not about what we "get out of it" nor even what we "put into it." Worship is all about praising and loving God and gathering as a community of faith around word & sacrament and allow God to do for us what God determines is best for us. I look forward to gathering with you regularly for worship where we return to God and offer our praises & thanksgivings for God's goodness. Here we are nurtured in faith and sent to bear witness to that faith in daily life. Loving Jesus—not only does it sound like a good title for a book but a great discipline for daily life.

# SECOND WEEK IN LENT Thursday, March 1 / Sunday, March 4

The second covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the one made with Abraham and Sarah: God's promise to make them the ancestors of many, with whom God will remain in everlasting covenant. Paul says this promise comes to all who share Abraham's faith in the God who brings life into being where there was no life. We receive this baptismal promise of resurrection life in faith. Sarah and Abraham receive new names as a sign of the covenant, and we too get new identities in baptism, as we

# THIRD WEEK IN LENT Thursday, March 8 / Sunday, March 11

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The ten commandments are one of the chief parts of Luther's catechism, a core piece of baptismal instruction. They begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can
