PASTORAL REFLECTIONS—Pastor

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Acts 2:4

A recent Bible Study group was discussing the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. In our conversation, we began to ponder this mysterious and often under-valued person of the god-head. In the Large Catechism, Luther wrote more on the third article than on either of the others—twice as much as on the first article (God the Father), and almost three times as much as on the second (God the Son). So why is it that we — Lutherans — are often quick to dismiss the person and work of the Holy Spirit? The first reference to the Holy Spirit is in the first story of Genesis when the "wind/breath of God hovered over the face of the deep." I like to think of the Holy Spirit as God's creative power in the world. Jesus describes it as Advocate whom he would send after his ascension to be with the disciples in furthering the mission of Christ's church. The book of Acts is filled with references to the Holy Spirit and the rate by which the Christian community grew is truly impressive as the direct result of the work of the Holy Spirit. May 27 is the Day of Pentecost and often considered the birthday of the church. The Bible study group thought it would be fun to sample what that first Pentecost experience might be like when the Spirit came upon the believers like the sound of a mighty wind and people began to speak in different languages. The challenge therefore is to learn a phrase in what you consider to be your native tongue. At the end of worship on May 27, we will share that phrase aloud and make a noise that might be reminiscent of that special day. The phrase? "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." I was amazed to learn that among those 15 or so people at the Bible study, there were at least a dozen different languages represented. German, Finn, Polish, Dutch, Norwegian, Swede, Dane to name a few. What language might you share? I urge you to learn this phrase and be prepared to share it aloud as a whole. It might be fun to consider all the many voices through which we call upon the name of the Lord and yet who are called to serve a common mission and purpose.
