CHRISTIAN ED NEWS FROM-Matt

In the 8th chapter of Acts, Philip approached an Ethiopian eunuch who was reading scripture from the prophet Isaiah. He asked the eunuch if he understood what he has reading. To which the eunuch replied "How can I, unless someone guides me?" These verses indicate that from the very beginning education has been an important part of faith formation in the lives of Christians. Christian Education is at the heart of the ministry happening here at Saint Andrew and I'm excited to be a part of it as it continues to be an integral component of our ministry together.

I grew up in a family of educators and learned quickly the importance that teaching and learning from each other has in the life of a community. As I reflected on this I found these words from the ELCA statement on education to be exceptionally relevant to the role of education in our lives here and the work we will be doing.

As Lutherans we understand our vocation is a calling from God that encompasses all of life for all the faithful. Education belongs to our baptismal vocation. Our particular calling in education is two-fold: to educate people in the Christian faith for their vocation and to strive with others to ensure that all have access to high-quality education that develops personal gifts and abilities and serves the common good. A Word of Clarity

Beginning this fall, confirmation classes will be for **7th and 8th grade students only**. The **6th grade students** will focus on Bible basics over the Christian education hour on *Sunday mornings* in anticipation of and preparation for confirmation the next year.

Middle school (grades 7 & 8) and high school youth group will meet separately at 9:30 on Sunday mornings to think about faith through Bible study, engage in fun activities, build relationships, and make plans for different fellowship and service opportunities. High school students will meet in the youth room and middle school students will meet in the activity room, beginning September 16th. I look forward to learning and sharing with you as part of the work we do for the sake of Christ's church.

Instead, a living Christian faith expresses itself in acts of compassion and mercy for those in need.
