PASTORAL REFLECTIONS FROM — *Pastor Craig*

In a recent article from the editor in The Lutheran (September 2012) comes the following reflection about this summer's National Youth Gathering event in New Orleans. "The gathering was a time to grasp the beauty of what God has allowed us to receive and share as grace-drenched Lutherans who sometimes forget how much this world hungers for a story of hope and spiritual depth. It was a foretaste of what our ELCA could become if we really believed that every congregation could be a mission community re-rooting in their communities where God is already creating new signs of the presence of the risen Christ."

It was a hot and dry summer and different sources advised it would be a good thing to aerate my lawn. Doing so pulls plugs of soil from the sod to allow moisture to penetrate and encourage root development which makes for a healthier lawn. I have long understood the consequences of soil compaction as it relates to healthy roots. When the soil is hard and dry, the roots cannot penetrate deep into the soil and the plants suffer for lack of water and vital nutrients. When the soil is moist and fertile, roots are strong and plants are healthier. A couple hours of labor seemed a good investment in a healthier lawn.

The same holds true for our faith. Unless we tend to the roots of faith we can waver at the first challenge we face and the good we intend suffers for lack of hope and encouragement. We need a deeper connection. We need to allow God to feed our faith Word and Sacraments, by worship and education. Regular worship is like a sport's practice or scrimmage. We can't go it alone. Regular watering and amending of the soil results in lives that are vibrant and ready to respond in witness and service through Christ's mission. Fed and nourished we are more drought tolerant and better equipped as citizens in God's kingdom. We are more readily prepared to share of our time and our resources for we realize we are part of the same mission with shared vision for the work God has entrusted to our care.

The life and ministry of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall be open to all who wish to express their faith in God through Jesus Christ by worship, learning, witness and service.
