BECAUSE OF CHRIST...

I was out for dinner with an old childhood friend – and over some Mexican cuisine we spent some time catching up on the state of our lives. While our situations vary, it seemed as though we both were sharing out of a sense of depravity. In search for balance, success, and happiness, we both were skipping over where life was full to consider the places in our lives that were not-so-full.

In Numbers 11, the LORD was angry, Moses was displeased and begging for his own death, and the Israelites were complaining. They had eaten the manna that the LORD has provided but now they couldn't stand it. Fine flakey bread mashed into cakes was all they had eaten – and they had such powerful memories of the fish, cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions, and garlic they had for food back in Egypt. How could Moses bear the weight of 600,000 people and the depth of their cravings for food more substantial than the manna? The Israelites were so hungry that they longed to go back to Egypt. Perhaps their time in the wilderness shortened their memories. While they ate well in Egypt, they were enslaved by Pharaoh and forced into labor. Egypt was not better.

Our cravings take us into some strange wilderness places. A sense of purpose, a better relationship, more things or power or status – whatever the case, we long for a completeness that doesn't seem to ever be met. We say to one another, "Life would be better if..." When we do that, we acknowledge a certain kind of incompleteness and a kind of hunger that never seems to be satisfied. In the book of Numbers, God hears the cries of the Israelites and provides them with quail for food – beyond what they could imagine. And all the more, God's spirit is present with them, resting in the camp. God hears their cry, satisfies their hunger, and they are nourished.

A prayer I often pray when I feel unsatisfied is this, "God, thank you for making me whole." While we experience loss and longing, we can remember that God is present with us even in the midst of our cravings, providing in ways beyond what we could imagine. Yes, "life may be better if..." but as beloved children of God we are fed and nourished, and indeed, because of Christ, we are whole.

PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CRAIG

I recently received an email with the following quote by an author whom I admire. "Community is not a talent show in which we dazzle the world with our combined gifts. Community is the place where our poverty is acknowledged and accepted, not as something we have to learn to cope with as best we can but as a true source of new life." — Henri Nouven

That simple quote got me thinking...How many times do we focus on our weaknesses as deficiencies rather than seeing our weaknesses as part of who we are? Not as smart, not as strong, not as wealthy, not as privileged, not as (fill in the blank). We live in a culture that rewards and celebrates and honors people for their

successes but criticizes and takes pity on those who just don't measure up. How might we respond to one another differently if we accepted one another for who we are rather than for who we want others to be? How might that affect our sense of community? Imagine the strength we would

experience if we recognize as Saint Paul describes, "power made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:9 We are pretty good at identifying strengths but what about accepting weaknesses, limitations, or

deficiencies? I like the word that is hidden in comm**unity**. It is easy to identify in print but what might it look like as a true source of new life?
