One of the most beloved Psalms includes this phrase, "he leads me along right pathways for his name's sake." We most often think of Psalm 23 at the time of a death for it describes a shepherd who is with us in dark valleys even death's valley, lest we be afraid. These indeed are comforting words at the time of a death but they are also reassuring words for life's journey as well.

Here Jesus makes it explicit that the reversal of values in God's community is a direct challenge to the values of the dominant culture, where wielding power over others is what makes you great. When we pray "your kingdom come" we are praying for an end to tyranny and oppression. We pray for this gathered around the cross, a sign of great shame yet transformed to be the sign of great honor and service.



HEBREWS 4:12
