## FOR ALL THE SAINTS

This year's National Youth Gathering was titled "Citizens with the Saints" where 33,000 youth from across the church gathered for worship, celebration, motivation, fellowship and service. Together, the gathering reflected the church as partners with the citizens of New Orleans and participants in God's work through the hands, voices and images of saintly people, young and old around a common theme. The well-planned Worship Workshop held recently at Saint Andrew (thanks to the Worship Ministry) was called "Equipping the Saints." The focus for the event was to bring people together to brush up on leadership skills or learn new ones for the purpose of more effective participation in the worship life of the congregation. If you missed it, perhaps another opportunity could be provided early next year.

Each year, the church pauses to recognize the festival of All Saints. The day of celebration is literally on November 1 but the church commonly designates the Sunday on or just after November 1 as All Saints Sunday making November 4 All Saints Sunday this year with Thursday worship literally on All Saints Day. But just what is a saint? Who are the saints in our lives that strengthen and encourage us in our walk of faith and life?

Saints language is nothing new but we often forget who we are as saints and fellow participants in the life of Christ's church in mission and ministry with the saints. Martin Luther defined a saint as a "forgiven sinner." Luther helped define our common understanding that in this life we are both saint and sinner at the same time (simul justus, et peccator—simultaneously we are both saint and sinner) and miraculously, God loves us anyway. It is common to describe the church as both militant and triumphant. The militant church is the living Body of Christ while the triumphant church is representative of those who have died, apart from the body, but alive in the heavenly kingdom with God and all who have died in faith. It was on the eve of All Saints that Martin Luther posted his 95 statements intended for debate within the Roman church on the doors of the church in Wittenburg, Germany knowing the church would be filled with those who came to give thanks and pray for the lives of the saints on November 1. The reformed church therefore describes October 31 as Reformation Day, a day when the church was challenged to reconsider current practices that had become part of church tradition but not necessarily rooted in scripture.

Each year, we remember the saints of the church and we give thanks to God for those who remain in this life as well as for those who have gone before us but who are very much part our identity as the Body of Christ. In worship on these days, we will list the names of the saints who have joined the church triumphant and name aloud those saints who have died during the past year. It is both a sad time of remembering but also an encouraging time of celebrating for we live by faith and we know that even the best life has to offer is temporary. "For the things that are seen are temporary, but the things that are unseen eternal." (2 Corinthians 4:18)

For all the Saints in this life and in the next...we will and we do give God thanks.

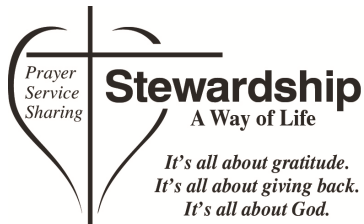

Soon you will receive the second mailing of the fall stewardship emphasis. This mailing includes an article about the importance of planned giving. The mission of the church is dependent on regular and generous giving that not only supports the mission by paying the bills but provides a means by which people can faithfully return a portion of the resources God has entrusted to us as stewards.

This year's theme reminds us that stewardship is not simply a year-end push by the church to beg for money in support of the next year's budget. Stewardship is a way of life and it is reflective through prayer, service and sharing for in truth, all we have is a gift from God. Jesus spoke candidly and often about money, most often criticizing those who were stingy with their sharing. Stinginess is not a biblically responsible way of caring for and sharing what God has entrusted to us. Generosity, proportionately and willingly are all words that are far more reflective of how Jesus described a faithful way of living out our identity as stewards. When the mailing arrives next week, spend some time in prayerful reflection and consider how you are responding with what God has given you to manage and to share.

## SECOND/THIRD GRADE BIBLES

As part of the church school program at Saint Andrew, second and third grade students are given a Bible to use at home and at church. This is an effort to assist parents in their responsibility to place in their child's hand the holy scriptures and nurture him or her in faith and prayer. This Bible will be used through their confirmation education.



It is a great privilege to share this experience with students. Parents of second and third graders, as you are able, please come with your child to one of two worship services where you can formally present your child with their own Bible: **Thursday, November 8 at 6:15 pm or Sunday, November 11 at 10:30 am.**

A letter was mailed last week to parents of second and third grade students regarding receiving a Bible. If you did not receive a letter and have a child that should receive a Bible this year, please call the church office to let us know.

While we do not require families to pay for these Bibles, at a cost of \$16 per Bible any monetary donation to help offset the cost would be appreciated. Through Christ, we live and learn together.

## A VARIETY OF GIFTS...

This past week, clergy from around the East Central Synod of Wisconsin gathered for a Theological Conference. A question asked by one of the presenters was this, *"What are the signs of life in your congregation?"* When I reflected over the ministries at Saint Andrew, I couldn't help but think about one sign of life in particular. While I am still new myself, I am also discovering that many are new to the community, whether new members or visitors who come to worship on Sundays.

Over the past month many people have joined the family of faith at Saint Andrew. I am inspired by these men and women. As we gathered in the chapel over the last two Sundays, I heard their stories. Many have come from other denominational backgrounds. Many were looking for a place of welcome—where they could be married, where they could raise a family. Many were hoping to connect in ways that align with their gifts and interests. These people and these conversations are significant signs of life.

Saint Andrew is a vibrant congregation, filled with life and vitality. I am excited to think about how God might call out the gifts of these new members. But I am even more excited when I think about the variety of gifts already within the membership here. One of my favorite lines in the mission statement of Saint Andrew is this, *"With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the life and mission of this church can be fulfilled by those within it."*
