PASTORAL REFLECTIONS BY PASTOR CRAIG

My annual report describes 2012 as a year of transitions. Beginning with the approval of a five-year staffing plan in the fall of 2011, it seems there has been one transition after another for an entire year with both beginnings and endings. It's nice to think that there are no major anticipated transitions as we "transition" into a new year of ministry. With an early Lenten season (Ash Wednesday is February 13) our minds quickly shift from one season to the next. Christmas is behind us and Epiphany is soon behind us. Spring seed catalogs are arriving in the mail and our thoughts project us to longer days of daylight and anticipation of warmer days ahead.

Sometimes it seems we are always looking forward to the next event or opportunity and I fear we overlook the opportunities of present reality. What is your current stage of life? How are you enjoying the blessings of the present? It is only a matter of time and another transition comes along and we adjust yet again to the next opportunity.

The Stewardship theme for this year was printed on materials that arrived in the mail. So as we begin a new year together I pause to recall how grateful I am to serve among you in this great church and I look forward to the transitions that are before us and the work that God in Christ Jesus continues to provide for us.

 — SERVICE OF THE WORD —

Every single time we worship, we gather to celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And each year, 40 days known as *Lent* are set aside to contemplate what the story of Christ's passion means for each of us individually and as a community. During these 40 days, with the whole church, we are invited into a time of remembrance. We acknowledge...

- ...that we are in need of repentance and God's mercy;
- ...that we are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another and to live in harmony with creation;
- ...that our sinfulness keeps us feeling separated from God, from neighbors, and creation.

During these 40 days, with the whole church we are invited to the discipline of *Lent*. For some this may seem like an opportune time to cut out chocolate or soda or add something like the reading of scripture each day. These are good disciplines. But at the heart of discipline are boundaries and intentionality. As a parent knows, discipline is also the way that children learn from places of error and brokenness. At the heart of the word *discipline*, is the word *disciple*. As disciples of Christ Jesus, we follow along with Christ on the journey toward the cross.

This Lent we are invited to the disciplines of self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love-strengthened by the gifts of Grace—word and sacrament. We journey together through these forty days, and to the three great days of Jesus' death and resurrection — the greatest story of God's love for us. We do not walk alone — we walk with one another, and Christ comes with us.

THE THEME THIS LENTEN SEASON

Questions around the Cross



*"Take up your cross
and follow me"*

Faith is a mystery. Faith Clings to hope that the promises of God are true. But so often, questions arise about God and the state of our lives, causing us to wonder...

- How can I believe in a God I cannot see?*
- Why is my life so difficult?*
- Why doesn't God solve all my problems?*
- What is the purpose of my life?*
- Where are you God?*

Questioning takes courage. It's the way we learn and grow. Questioning is not the opposite of faith, rather—questioning is a faithful response to the mystery of God's love. When we keep the questions coming, we keep the conversation going with God and one another. This Lent we explore together one of the greatest mysteries of faith—God breaking into our lives with a love that can't be destroyed.

As we meet together on the Wednesdays of Lent we will meet around the story of the cross. As we worship, we will meet around these questions. Let's get curious together because God is not only found in answers—God is also in the questions.

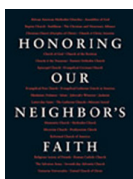
ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS
