GOING THROUGH...

On my last night in the mountains of Colorado, some friends and I sat on the porch of an old cabin. As we sat there in the dark we took in the moon and the stars and listened to the distant sounds of the river. It was dark and late and I was tired.

When I got up to go into the cabin I carefully looked down to make sure that I wouldn't trip over anything or miss a step. The only problem with looking down was that I completely missed the door and smacked right into the wall (which bruised both my forehead and my ego!). My friend said to me in a comical tone, "You know Jenn; you should go through the door!"

We walk through physical doors every day. Doors are transitional spaces that take us from one room to another. When it comes to Holy Week, we can't go around it, or over it, or under it – together, in order to get to a deeper meaning of Easter, we must go through.

Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday serve as the doorway to the celebration of Easter. The story of Jesus' triumphal entry to Jerusalem, the remembrance of the last supper in the upper room, the arrest and trial of Jesus, his journey to the cross and his death are all crucial to our understanding of what took place on that first Easter morning.

Jesus' life was about standing with us in the face of suffering and death. Jesus' suffering and death was the doorway to life abundant and everlasting. In the cross and in the resurrection – there we see God's amazing love for us and for the world.

In order to get to Sunday, we go through Friday. In order to get to the resurrection, we go through the cross. As we enter into these final days of Lent and into Holy Week, I encourage you to be a part of the entire journey by coming and joining us for Lenten worship and Holy Week services. May your journey be one that will deepen your understanding of God's amazing love for us in Christ Jesus.
