PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

The focus of the mid-week Lenten worship services have prompted us with questions around the cross. How can I believe in a God I cannot see? Why is my life so difficult? Why doesn't God solve all my problems? What is the purpose of my life? Where are you God? I am quite sure we did not fully answer all these questions but I am hopeful the process at very least offered permission to consider pondering over some of life's challenging questions as we journey in the shadow of the cross. Now with the resurrection promise before us, we will be challenged to ask yet more questions, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" "Have you believed because you have seen me?" "Children, you have no fish, have you?"

The introduction to a satirical comedy skit from a weekly public radio broadcast, "A Prairie Home Companion," goes as follows, "A dark night in a city that knows how to keep its secrets, but one man is still trying to find the answers to life's persistent questions, Guy Noir, Private Eye." Through the skit, the cast presents some ridiculous, but often humorous, examples of life drama that are not resolved but help point out that, life as we know it, often seems a bit farfetched and unbelievable. Life has its fair share of challenges and uncertainties which often cause us to question the nature of and the presence of God. In the depths of our despair, we wonder, "Where are you God?"

We are coming out of a winter season and soon there will be signs of new life blossoming forth. Such new life cannot be rushed and cannot be manufactured. It takes time for snow to melt, the ground to thaw and the earth to warm as the sun appears higher on the horizon and we are bathed again in a season where hope literally springs forth from the cold ground. This is a sign of real resurrection promise and we have the good fortune of having experienced both the cold fallow time of winter which leads to the hopeful anticipation of spring. How long will winter last? When will the birds sing again, and the flowers bloom? Soon. Very soon. And we will know the joy and excitement that new life will bring. Blessed Easter! Blessed spring!
