## REFLECTIONS ON STEWARDSHIP BY *Pastor Craig*

Over the years, I have grown to appreciate the following Offertory Prayer: *"Merciful Father, we offer with thanksgiving what you have first given us—ourselves, our time and our possessions, signs of your gracious love. Receive them for the sake of him who offered himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord."* It has always been a good reminder to me that all we have, self, time and possessions, are gifts from a loving and gracious God. The words to this simple prayer define a relationship and encourages me to be intentional with my response to the ways God has chosen to reveal blessings in our lives. The blessings may not always be that obvious and our response may not always be intentional but prayer tempers our hearts and lives in such a way that allows us to see life as an abundance of God's goodness, even when challenges weigh heavy upon us. From the very breath we take to the beauty that surrounds us, all we have is a gift provided by a loving and generous God.

As the fall programs restart, many congregations make an effort to highlight a stewardship theme in order to anticipate the budgetary process for the coming year. Will there be enough financial commitments to support ministry needs, personnel costs and operational building expenses? Such are the questions that seem to be in the front of our minds when faced with the task of putting together a budget to anticipate the financial needs of the church for the coming year. But what would it look like as we enter the conversations about stewardship if we took a step back and pondered the Offertory Prayer to recognize that all we have—self, time and possessions—are gifts from God? Words of David are recorded in Psalm 24, *"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it. The world and those who live in it."* When we see everything as gift, we begin to see ourselves not as consumers but as stewards with responsibilities for all entrusted to our care. We begin to see that budgeting is a small part of what it means to be a steward and that life as a steward is more about finding ways to be faithfully responsible to nurture and care for all of life. We see self, not as defined by worldly standards, but through Godly standards. We see self as child of God, fellow workers in God's kingdom and we see possessions as "tools" for the work we do together in God's kingdom and enhancements of God's generosity.

Next week, you will receive a mailing from Saint Andrew as the first part of the fall stewardship program. It is what has become known as the "Time and Talent" booklet. This mailing will encourage you to give thought to the time and abilities entrusted to your care. Please take a moment to consider efforts to share in the ministry needs of the church. Two weeks later, you will receive a mailing that encourages your financial commitment to the ministry efforts of 2014. Please see this not as a church in need of what you have but as a church that is committed to faithful ways of both receiving and sharing the gifts provided to fulfill the mission and ministry opportunities entrusted to us. May all gifts, small and great be shared as signs of God's gracious love.

Thank you for sharing as workers in God's kingdom!
