PASTORAL VISION—Pastor Craig

Karen and I travelled 300 miles on a cold January day five years ago to visit the area for the first time and interview for this call as pastor at Saint Andrew. I remember the increasing amounts of snow as we progressed north and the piles around the church were significantly larger than we have now. Snow was falling that weekend and I remember the last question I was asked in my interview, "if we would invite you back for a follow up interview, would you return?" Looking out the window and seeing the snow covered trees, I said, "if you can assure me it will be this beautiful next time, I will definitely come." I was asked, and on Valentine's Day weekend, we returned to another wintery weekend. I am thankful for the visit and continue to be thankful for the opportunity to minister among you.

While weather conditions do present challenges, it is truly what I love about life in the mid-west. Rain and blossoms in the spring, warmth and growth in the summer, cool evenings and colorful leaves in the fall and snow covered landscapes in the winter. I know I do not share this appreciation with everyone as both hot and cold conditions complicate life and create dangerous conditions, but with proper preparations and exercising a bit of caution and discretion, we can navigate the extremes and adjust to the conditions in ways that are less threatening. Last week was bitter cold and was dangerous for a large segment of the US population. But today is a welcomed dose of fresh snow coming just before Badger State Winter games and to refresh many outdoor winter activities.

Being prepared is often a matter of perception. We can allow life events to overshadow us or we can recognize that there is a larger picture and being rooted in a plan that is larger than our specific plans can be freeing and comforting. Now that we are into a new year and planning for another year of ministry, it is time to make plans and to find ways to incorporate into the life of the church. It is time to plan beyond the annual meeting and anxiety about budget restrictions. It is time to plan for Lent, Easter, summer camps, Vacation Bible School, summer bike trip, vacations, weddings, a garden.

Sometimes those plans have to be reshaped but I believe it is better to reshape a plan than to have no plan at all. What are your plans for the life and opportunities entrusted to your care? Do you see life as a gift to be shared or as a burden to be endured? Do you see the opportunities as yours to be advantaged or yours to be shared? Winter is a time of fallow, a time when the earth rests so that when the snow melts and the earth warms, new life breaks forth. Embrace the fallow winter and realize there is another season just ahead. As we wait and as we transition, we can count blessings and know that as John's gospel declares, "the light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it."

Did you know??? Each week there is an opportunity to worship on Thursday as an alternative to Sundays? When weekend schedules are full, many people find Thursdays to be a good substitute to the Sunday time to gather around word and sacrament. Planning on being out of town for the weekend? Consider the preceding Thursday worship opportunity and remain connected.

Who's Got Talent!


