Reflections by Pastor Craig

This is an exciting time of the year! The daylight hours are growing longer, the snow piles are beginning to melt and the air warms as the angle between the sun and the earth shifts further north. It is a transformational and exciting time of the year as we anticipate signs of new life birthing from the womb and the earth. Even with the remaining spurts of winter's cold, spring is certainly upon us. It has been a challenging winter for many people and recent days of temperatures above freezing lift our spirits and brighten our days. The gloom of winter is waning and spring is coming.

This is an exciting time in the life of the church as well. We symbolically have hidden/ buried the Alleluia proclamation from our liturgy and replaced it with the phrase that reminds us to "return to the Lord our God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love". Through Lent we refocus our lives on the cross and are drawn deeply into the transforming message that brings hope in the darkness and life in the face of death. Just as we cannot hide from the darkness nor walk away from the shadows of winter, so we do not hide from the message of Lent. We face our journey through the cross and as a result, we are strengthened and encouraged in our weakness and our joy is restored as we are drawn closer to the Son and his redeeming power through death and resurrection.

Easter is coming, indeed, it is already here and the signs of life are all around us. Even though we intentionally reflect on the passion of our Lord and the shadow of the cross in this season of Lent, we are at the same time renewed in our faith and we face life's challenges, not with fear or worry, but with confident hope knowing that death did not have the last word for Jesus and therefore, it will not be our defining identity either. Saint Paul reminds us that we are united with Christ through our baptism and just as he was lifted up, so will we rise in order to live full and abundant lives. Spring is coming. Easter is coming. We are excited to step forward and into the light of the sun/Son and the life that is renewed around us as we anticipate the hopeful and joyous chorus, "Alleluia, Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!!!

SALC Endowment News

Thanks to a recent generous gift of \$5,000, the Saint Andrew Endowment Fund is on its way to supporting future mission work of the church. While we hope there are other gifts that will soon be added, this is a good start toward allowing us to offer grant disbursements from the fund for expanded ministry opportunities through Saint Andrew. From a recent questionnaire, we learned that of 118 responses, 71 people admitted to having a will. While 13 people said they have remembered ministries of Saint Andrew in their will, 51 said they would consider doing so! This information indicates there is great potential for this fund to expand in the near future. In order to assist with this expansion, the SALC website now has a link to the Endowment Fund following the Ministries/Stewardship tabs. Here you can find an Information Page, Grant Application and a Statement of Intent. Applications will be considered after the fund reaches \$25,000 and intent documents can be filled out and sent to the church at any time to express future intentions to support the work of Christ's church through an endowed gift. If you would like to learn more about ways to participate in this program, please contact the church office to arrange a conversation with one of the committee members about creative ways to extend your support beyond your current giving.
