*Reflections by Pastor Jenn*

When Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit onto his disciples and says to them, "Peace be with you. As the father has sent me, so I send you," he connects the disciples with the mission of sharing the good news (John 20:21). The resurrection was the catalyst that turned the gathered ones into the ones who are sent.

Likewise, the message of Easter connects us to the mission of God. A former pastor of mine once suggested that all churches ought to have revolving doors installed in the back of their sanctuary to remind people that we are not consumers when it comes to church, but rather, we are a part of a constant flow of those who gather and are sent.

When we gather for worship, when we connect and build relationships, when we are saturated with the language of faith, we are filled with forgiveness and love and then nourished and refreshed, we are sent by the Holy Spirit to serve. In the pattern of gathering and sending, we become the risen body of Christ in the world.

That's one of the many reasons quilts hang on the walls at church. People gather on Tuesdays to sew and put together quilts that are then sent either locally, or around the globe through Lutheran World Relief to bring comfort. Because people are gathered and sent, we have communion bread for worship—faithful folks spend time in their kitchen baking and forming the loaves so that they may be shared with the body of Christ.

This gathering and sending compels people to serve on ministries or bring in food for the food baskets that are distributed to those in need. This gathering and sending is one of the reasons we will walk with Matt Seegert, who finishes his time with us at Saint Andrew in order to attend seminary.

This gathering and sending connects people from the reaches of our community together with one another in ways that connect us to the mission of God in our daily lives. We are indeed the body of Christ, risen and sent, at work in the world. Alleluia, Christ is Risen!

The life and ministry of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall be open to all who wish to express their faith in God through Jesus Christ by *worship, learning, witness and service.*

**PUTTING YOUR WISHES IN WRITING**

Without warning, life can change dramatically and can happen at any age. This is why it is important to plan ahead for a health care crisis.

A program on planning for future health care choices will be offered **Sunday, May 4, at 6:30 pm at Saint Andrew**. Margie Hackbarth from Aspirus will explain the process that involves the complex and sensitive issues of the thinking, planning and then communicating to our loved ones details that are important in advance of significant healthcare decisions.

During this hour-long program, Margie will cover Advance Directives and Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care. A time for discussion will follow, and for those interested, Margie will walk through the forms needed to complete your advance directive. Healthcare providers strongly recommend each person have this document on file.

Margie, is a certified First Steps Facilitator for Respecting Choices, an Advance Care Planning model used by many health systems.

There is a sign-up sheet at the Information Desk in the narthex to assist in planning for the event. As with all Saint Andrew events, this presentation is open to anyone who wishes to attend to learn more about healthcare decisions. A nursery will be provided.

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## BIKE TRIP

The following is the itinerary for the summer bike trip, for the week of July 27-August 2.

**July 27** - Depart from Saint Andrew at 1 pm

Arrive at Sparta and take a warm up ride in late afternoon to ensure equipment and riders are ready for a week of riding.

**July 28** - 44 mile ride

**July 29** - 28 mile ride and an afternoon swim at the Elroy pool

**July 30** - Break from riding—canoeing or kayaking on the Kickapoo River

**July 31** - 30 mile ride

**August 1** - 34 mile ride and a swim at the Wilton pool

**August 2** - Hike or geocache at Wildcat Mountain State Park

A big THANK YOU to Lucy Harvey for putting together this exciting adventure. Since we will be on riding trails, all that is needed is a comfortable bicycle. This is not a race but an adventure. We plan to take our time and do a good bit of exploring in the local areas. This is intended to be a sample experience and is attainable for most able bodied people. Pastor Craig is willing to lead a few rides prior to the trip to help us prepare for the week in the saddle. Two-hour long rides will be Saturdays, **May 31, June 14 and June 28**, starting at the SALC parking lot at 9 am.
