Reflections by Pastor Jenn

Tough decision: It's 10:30 Saturday morning. Do you go to the birthday party? Or do you go to the soccer game?

Both are great opportunities. If you go to the birthday party, you get to see your friends and eat cake. If you go to the soccer came, you get to see your friends and play soccer. There might be more of an "obligation" to go to the soccer game. After all, the team is counting on you and you made a commitment. But on the other hand, if the birthday party is for your friend, you might feel a deep sense of loyalty. So what to do? You want to be in both places but can only physically be in one place. Why, oh why, are they at the same time?!

Many of us are not deciding between going to a birthday party and a soccer game. But the dilemma of "choosing between" different opportunities is a common dilemma. We experience it in small ways when we're at the store, deciding between the brand we know and the more generic option. But we also encounter this dilemma on a larger scale. What do we do with our time? What do we prioritize? What choices do we make for children? Aging parents? Our work?

There are so many choices, and expectations, and commitments placed on people these days. Many of them are good opportunities. And yet, with limited time and resources, a choice must be made. So often, choices are made for the opportunity that has the most benefit, is the most nourishing, and will provide the greatest sense of return.

When we are in this midst of tough decisions—when we are unsure of where our priorities are—or even, when we are afraid we've made the wrong choice—*Could it be that God has it all in hand, looking at our lives in light of a bigger picture?* Pulling weeds where necessary? Using us to share and encounter the gospel wherever we are in light of whatever is decided? And Inviting us again and again to come and hear the life giving word and receive the meal of forgiveness?

The "benefit" of life with God is simply that—Life with God. But the choice is not ours. It has already been made. And God chooses you, calls you, and loves you. There is no better "return" than the experience of life only God provides.

As you are considering plans for the end of summer, you'll find many choices before you within these pages to connect to our life together: the church picnic, Sunday school and rally day with classes for adults and children, the return of 10:30 church (on Sept. 7), a blood drive, the youth gathering in 2015, and even the blessing of pets and animals! Come and experience life together in community.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our current mortgage on our building is \$1.4 million. We make monthly payments of \$12,500. For June, out of that \$12,500, \$4,933 was for interest and \$7,568 went against our principle. At this rate, our mortgage will be paid off in 2026. Our current interest rate is 4.29% on a 12 year loan.

Our Free for Missions program was designed for those who could afford a little extra each month to help pay down our loan a little faster. For June, our Free for Mission payment of

\$6,460 went directly against the principle. If we average \$5,200 a month for Free for Missions, our mortgage will be paid off 5 years sooner. This of course depends on the amount our members contribute to Free for Missions, and the fact that we will not have to borrow money to meet our current monthly obligations.

SUNDAY SCHOOL KICKS OFF! RALLY DAY INFORMATION—September 7

CONFIRMATION ORIENTATION


