Pastor Craig

It has recently become clear that there is room for improving how members of Saint Andrew are informed and invited into more meaningful support and participation. While it may be tempting to publicize giving and membership trends as a means of motivating people, in truth, numbers and statistics do not inspire. Stories of changed lives motivate and inspire people. Think of all the organizations that solicit our support. The most motivating of these efforts tell us how lives are affected because of generous and intentional support and participation. Homes are built. Children are fed. The ill and grieving ones are comforted. I would bet most of us could bring to mind images of changed lives as we think about Unicef, The United Way, Salvation Army, Habitat for Humanity, even the Boy and Girl Scouts. What images come to mind for you when you think about Saint Andrew Lutheran Church? Do you think about weekly worship and the many who come to receive affirmation of forgiveness, to join in fellowship, to serve others, to proclaim the gospel through music and prayer, to study the bible, learn effective ways of witnessing faith and life? Do we expect lives to be changed and influenced in a way that helps us make a difference in our world? Are we renewed in our understanding of where God is revealed and trained to become more effective in reflecting God's love and grace in our everyday lives?

Ideas began to circulate at Ministry Night recently to consider making an intentional effort to connect to the 900 plus family units who are members of Saint Andrew to ask a few questions that may help focus how we shape ministry efforts in ways that are desired and meaningful. How can we be more intentional about supporting others rather than trying to repackage stewardship without feeling it is little more like a plea for money rather than encouragement for expanded participation and clearer vision of the story of God at work in and around us? What are the needs of your family that would improve if you were more connected to some area of church life? Where are the voids in your life that worldly attempts have failed to fill?

As Saint Andrew begins its 35th year of ministry, some are beginning to ask how we can expand and enhance the mission and message of Christ through Saint Andrew. A group of volunteers is being formed to ask how we can be more effective in informing and inviting people into deeper relationships through Saint Andrew. Do not be surprised if someone knocks at your door in the near future and asks about your ideas and concerns regarding your connection to Saint Andrew. The questions that will be asked are less important than the stories you provide. Thank you in advance for your willingness to share and dream about the future vision of Saint Andrew. What changes do you see taking place? What stories motivate and inspire your participation and support? Your response is valued and much appreciated. Thank you!
