#### Did you know?

- SALC operates a food pantry available to members and the community?
- The ministry operates entirely on your support?
- The ministry does not receive any funding through our church budget?
- How is the ministry funded? Through your support of Lenten Soup Dinners, the Super Bowl snack sale, individual monetary donations and the food item donations that are placed in the baskets at the entry doors.

#### Here is what the ministry did in 2014 on behalf of you and Saint Andrew:

- 38 emergency food baskets
- 40 Easter and Christmas food baskets
- Served over 700 plates of food at 6 Sunday Community Dinners
- Donated 10 gallons of soup to the Empty Bowls event to support The Neighbors Place
- Served 70 plates at the first Thanksgiving dinner prepared and served at Saint Andrew
- Working with the Tuesday morning quilters, 76 quilts, along with 52 backpacks filled with school supplies, were shipped to Lutheran World Relief. Quilts were also donated to Hospice and the The Women's Community Shelter.
- Monetary donations were made to the Saint Andrew youth group, Channel 7 "Share the Holidays", Hardel's Hope, Shared Blessings, Bridge Community Health Clinic and Lutheran World Relief to help with the cost of shipping the quilts and school bags.

#### Fair Trade Coffee, Tea, Hot Cocoa and Chocolates

Fair trade products are purchased by the ministry and offered to you at cost. Your support of Fair Trade products directly helps Global Farmers.

So far in 2015, the ministry has donated to the Hygiene Drive, and as a result of the Lenten Soup and Sandwich surveys, donations were made to: Never Forgotten Honor Flight, SALC VBS, The Women's Community and the Wausau Community Warming Center. Also, \$900 was received during the fourth week of Soup and Sandwich and donated to the ELCA World Hunger "Walk for Water". **Your continued support is greatly appreciated!**

#### **ENDOWMENT CHALLENGE**
