Easter Proclamation—Pastor Jenn

The other day as I was driving along Hwy. R on my way home — and by the time I was crossing the bridge over the Rib River — I became very aware of the litter along the highway.

Once hidden in deep snow, the early melt gave way to revealing the cans, cups, wrappers, and bags alongside the road. And then the other evening, while walking up Rib Mountain, I became very aware of the large amount of sand on the walk way, once was used to coat the icy roads and walk ways with a little bit of traction. Winter snow had also covered up the fall leaves that were trapped for a season and now lay tattered and exposed, awaiting street sweepers and city crews to come along and make the roads ready for spring once again.

Although at first a seemingly gloomy and dismal thing, the sand and rubbish and leaves are signs that spring has fully arrived. With spring comes the return of green grass and budding flowers, robins hopping around the yard, and, for some, the impulse to deep clean and unclutter dwellings. With the return of light at the end of the day and warmer temperatures, relief comes to our bodies and our souls through the joy of open windows, longer walks, and bike rides. The early arrival of the seasonal spring weather is fitting because Easter also came early this year.

While so much emphasis is focused upon the day of Easter itself in the life of the church, Easter is an entire season that we will celebrate long into the month of May. The gospel texts will bring us revelation after revelation of the risen Christ appearing to the disciples. Jesus will show them the residue of the former season of his life and his journey to the cross. And much like the trash on the side of the road, the marks from the nails on his hands and feet will serve as signs for the disciples, that they can truly believe and trust that Christ has returned — risen from the dead, just as he said he would, to offer them new life. Very soon, this band of disciples will be transformed into the early church and the story of Jesus' victory over death will become hope and life that offers resurrection to the whole entire world!

In the season of Easter, we proclaim that Christ is risen. But we also proclaim that in Christ's resurrection, we are risen! So now, much like the disciples, we are invited to live as risen people. As Easter people, we are invited to no longer focus on the rubbish inside of our own existence, but on the forgiveness and new life that God has given us through Christ. It's easy to see the trash when the snow melts away. The places in our lives we wish weren't as ugly or discontent. In Christ, the windows of our hearts are opened wide, and the Holy Spirit breathes into us and works in those rubbishy places to restore and transform them into places of healing, life, and wholeness. In worship, the paschal candle will stay lit as a sign of that resurrection and the proclamation will echo long after Easter day has gone, *Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!*

HEARING LOOP TO BE INSTALLED IN THE SANCTUARY

"So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10:17 In a project for confirmation, Caleb asks a question: "Think about this, can you imagine yourself as a person being deaf and going to church and you can't understand the pastors? It is difficult to hear in church with a hearing aid, as there is so much background noise. Using a loop system lets people with hearing aids hear without the background noises." Thanks to Caleb and his family, and to the generosity of others through memorial gifts and grants, a hearing loop system will be installed in the sanctuary at Saint Andrew in mid to late April. Those who use hearing aids that are equipped with T-coils should check with their audiologists to discover the settings that will help them to connect to the loop.
