Life Reflections by Pastor Jenn

The way I have been ending my prayers has shifted, as of late. One would think it would be easy to find the right words for prayer. But sometimes, it seems, we don't know quite what we should pray for. So I have come to the practice of ending with gratitude, thanking God for all of the blessings we receive in this life that we cannot even begin to name or call to mind.

A dear friend recently visited me, and with her visit, she shared gifts with me. I was so surprised. They were so thoughtful and so nice. I remember feeling like I wasn't worthy to receive them. Instead of simply feeling grateful to have received such wonderful gifts, I was distracted by how stingy I had been in the past when I had opportunity to share with her. This whole episode reminded me of a passage from Matthew's gospel, "Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone... If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!" (Matthew 7:9&11).

The cool crisp air and the bright blue sky. The vast array of color spread across the leaves atop Rib Mountain. The countless hugs, hellos, kind words, and even, the random smile of a stranger. Each are small gifts, in their own way. Tiny reminders that life and love, joy and belonging, are readily to be seen and experienced—if only we recognize them before us.

With the month of October comes the opportunity to consider the way we thank God for the many countless blessings and gifts that God provides. There's something about releasing what we cling to most tightly for security (whether it be our identity, our time, our money) in order to allow for God to work in through the chance we have to give. For some, giving comes naturally. You might even think of it as a spiritual gift. For others, giving is a challenge that pushes us to the edge. And even for others, giving feels as though it is not an option. Regardless of whatever the case is for you—the simple act of giving has the power to transform a person.

In the earliest of scriptures—it was grain, or meat that was offered up to God. The "first fruits" of the harvest from the labors of our hands. Over time, people with means would support the efforts of the earliest apostles—by providing space in their homes, people to join in the sharing of the mission, hospitality, and prayers. There are many ways to give. And regardless of the amount or form, it is all most appreciated—and it all matters.

On Thursday, November 3 and Sunday, November 6 we will have the chance to ask for God's blessings on the gifts that we pledge for the year before us. Please see this opportunity to consider supporting the mission of Christ's church at Saint Andrew, not out of obligation or for any other reason than the simple chance to share gratitude with God for the ways in which our lives are filled with something for which we could never pay: the sheer love and grace of God. A simple "thank you" does not seem adequate. But just the same, many thanks to you for the generous ways you have shared good gifts in this place.
