Pastor Craig

With the transition into a new set of months for a new year, many reflect on the past and recall the journey that shaped the year that is now behind us. Joys, sorrows, new beginnings, final endings, challenges, hopes, dreams, disappointments, confusion, fears and more hold the stories of what has been and now posture us to what is yet to come. As the year unfolds for our nation, it will be under the leadership of a new presidential model. For some, this brings hope. For some this brings fear. And for perhaps an even larger number, it brings uncertainty. In light of this reality, it is my prayer that even as wide as these extremes may seem, there is a common thread that unites us and gives us hope for an even wider image and purpose.

For some time now, I have begun to ponder how our life together might look if we intentionally focus our vision for the future so that efforts are united in witness and service and are collectively more unified through what we believe we are being called to accomplish on behalf of serving as kingdom workers through a common identity. Without a common vision, we can function like independent workers, all doing good things but without a clear sense of direction or purpose and that can drain energy and dampen enthusiasm. With a common vision, however, we can work together and our combined efforts can accomplish a great deal more.

As part of this common purpose, a few people have suggested a book called "The Purpose Driven Life" as a resource to facilitate these conversations. This opens the door to a theme for this coming Lent as 40 Days of Purpose and a plan to live with purpose and witness faith with intention. More information will be noted in the February issue of the Network to invite many into this journey.

This coming year is a significant year in the life of the church as we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation of the church. At the heart of this celebration is the awareness that all we have is pure gift. We know this to be God's divine grace, free and undeserved. We do nothing to bring about God's goodness but only asked to gladly receive what God provides and then generously and wisely share it with others. As we move into this banner year, I encourage us to keep this message central in the work we do to welcome the stranger, care for the sick, visit those who are isolated and alone, feed the hungry. As we do, we can know that we serve Christ who is among us and longs to embrace those who desperately need what God alone provides. We are instruments of God's grace. Join me in the melody of sharing in abundance so that we can be the best chorus possible as we witness and serve Christ together.
