Pastor Craig

I recently came across a blog post from a seminary site in Portland, Oregon. The post was an excerpt from a resource entitled, "*unhurry Up! into Easter: A Lenten Pilgrimage.*" This is a 40 day devotional designed for a Lenten journey to help process life as a pilgrimage rather than a tour. "The purpose of [a pilgrimage] is more about discovering, recovering and deepening the things of which will hold great value in life." "Many tourists, on the other hand, will actually calculate every stop of the trip...A tourist's goals are to see the important places, perhaps join a tour to learn some interesting new tidbits, and to chronical the trip with photos." Tourism involves an agenda while a pilgrimage embraces the mystery of the journey. Viewing life as a journey, which method of travel do you prefer and which is most common for you? While I like a plan, I tend to be a bit less structured and try to adapt when changes come rather than panic but I also see value of a more structured approach through those who help keep me and others on task. I see value through both. I am, however, intrigued by the idea presented in this blog of pilgrimage and feel it is a good model to consider as we begin a new year and the approaching Lenten season.

To begin this quest, I suggest two disciplines that might help us on this journey. First, plans are in place to offer a seven week study of a book entitled "The Purpose Driven Life." Individuals and couples are encouraged to participate in a 40 day commitment to process the question, "What on earth am I here for?" In other words, what is the plan or the purpose for my life? What does God have in mind for me? Two time schedules are outlined on page 5 of this issue that offer options to participate in a seven week effort that I hope will inspire a deepened awareness that God is shaping us into persons God desires us to be. Secondly, during Wednesdays in Lent, we will sample the stories of individuals from years ago who followed the call of the Lord and discovered God's promise and faithfulness as unwavering and life changing. We may have plans and goals, dreams and agendas, but those plans are not the markers that determine the way by which we measure success or failure. These are merely the map by which we navigate and structure our days and years toward a larger destination. You might also considering hiking or biking as a discipline for Lent.

Regardless what method you use, I am hopeful this Lent and the year ahead will provide opportunities to enrich and give purpose to your life and the journey we share together. May this inward focus our sites on the cross of Jesus so that we can more clearly follow his path that leads to a full and abundant life.

The life and ministry of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall be open to all who wish to express their faith in God through Jesus Christ by *worship, learning, witness and service.*

YOUTH SUMMER MISSION TRIP 2017



The youth ministry team selected an opportunity to serve on a mission trip for the summer of 2017 through an organization called *Appalachia Service Project*, ASP for short. The dates available to us are **the week of July 9-15 with some travel days needed prior to and following** since we have tentatively been assigned to serve in Eastern Kentucky. To learn more about the mission of ASP, you can check out their website: www.asphome.org/. In short, Saint Andrew youth will travel to work in smaller teams to help people achieve the goal of living in homes that are warmer, dryer and safer. While we will have some “training” prior to our departure – ASP is accustomed to working with volunteers who have a minimal skill level and will teach our group what is needed for the work before us.

We have reserved 14 spots for high school youth and 6 spots for adult chaperones. This means that commitments made need to be solid. Participation in the summer event will also mean participation in several pre-trip meetings and fundraisers that will take place to support our journey. If you know that you are interested in attending, an initial deposit of \$100 along with the commitment form (available on the Information Desk) will hold a spot. If more than 14 students register we will have a wait list. Registrations will be on a first come, first serve basis. Thank you for prayerfully considering this opportunity!
