## *A Lenten Message by Pastor Craig*

*"As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by Christ's authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins."*

These are words that are shared regularly with the gathered community in response to public confession for what we have "done and left undone" as a result of our imperfect nature. Try as we may, we cannot fulfill what is expected of us and we are left incomplete and in need of divine help. Only God can provide what we truly need and forgiveness ranks at the top. Even though they roll off my tongue from memory, I do not take the words I am humbled and authorized to share for granted. They are powerful words to hear and they are powerful words to speak for they convey a reality, "forgiveness of sins." It is important to acknowledge that at the core of our human fabric, we have a void that longs to be filled. It can be filled with things that consume us or things that fill us.

Sin causes the human heart to turn in on itself and seek to satisfy personal desires first before looking to the needs of others or considering how our actions may affect others. Sin is infectious and left to itself, will spread like diseased tissue. Sin lives in the core of our being and directs our thoughts, desires and actions often without our awareness. Confession is the admission that sin exists, we are incomplete and desperately need what we cannot provide on our own. Confession is good for the soul as it acknowledges that we need God to take away the sense of guilt and shame and to fill the aching desire in our lives that begs for wholeness. Forgiveness allows the opportunity for the renewing love of Jesus to fill the void and reshape what can be revealed through us.

Lent is a journey that focuses on the human act of repentance and the desire to receive the divine act of forgiveness that keeps us in relationship with God and one another. Lent is a journey that allows us to focus on the promise God has made through Jesus to name us and claim us and to join us as we strive to reflect God's love in the world. Forgiveness allows that love to be revealed all the more clearly and more genuinely as we are vessels of God's grace. As Lent unfolds, we participate in a 40 day pilgrimage together. May the time we share draw us closer to God's love and for our awareness that we are stronger together than we are apart. Blessings on the journey we take together.

## SALC SENDS MISSIONARIES TO KENTUCKY: JULY 2017

*Did the headline catch your attention?* We don't often think as youth summer trips through Saint Andrew as a chance to send missionaries out to help work in God's kingdom—but the opportunity given us this July truly does appear to be a Spirit-filled sending for people from among us to go and immerse themselves in a different place, to accompany those who could benefit from some focused work and care on their homes. No doubt those whom we send will come back with stories to tell and lives that are changed.

The mission of Appalachia Service Project, ASP for short, is to help make homes warmer, dryer and safer for people in need. Currently 11 youth and 4 adults are making preparations to go with available spots for four more high school aged students and two more adults. While the Saint Andrew deadline to register has past, we are able to extend the invitation to join us a few more weeks into early March if a student that you know still has interest in attending. Working in three smaller teams, we will be immersed in rural eastern Kentucky working from 8 am to 4:30 pm each day to learn what we can about the challenges faced by the families with whom we will work. There is a lot of prep work to do here before we go. Lessons include studying systemic poverty, using basic tools, and preparing our hearts through Bible Study and Prayer. Will you join us in prayer?
