Easter Reflections by Pastor Craig

While each gospel writer describes a slightly (or sometimes, not slightly) different version of the story of God's love for the world through Jesus, all set up the great mystery from the same perspective, "early on the first day of the week." Though this may seem small and insignificant, it tells us a great deal about how and where we look for God in everyday life. Consider how differently things appear after having risen from sleep and faced with the dawn of a new day. We identify days with beginnings and endings. A new day coming, and a day that has passed or spent. New year, new season, new month, new week, new day...new comes with hope, anticipation, expectation.

There is a stark contrast between the darkness of Good Friday and the light of Easter morning. Something has changed and the sad lament of Friday's cross turns to exciting alleluias of Easter's empty tomb and God's divine promise of life over death or more accurately, life *through* death.

There are certainly moments in life when it feels darkness has the upper hand and looms long. Just as certain as the pattern of day-night-day occurs, so, too, we can be assured that the stone has been rolled away and a new day has dawned. "Do not be afraid; I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said."

Waiting may seem long and the darkness of our dampened hopes and dreams may weigh heavy upon us. But we are Easter people. We are people of God's divine promise and we live with hopeful expectation knowing that death does not have the final word over us. God does, and God's word is life, abundant life now and in the life yet to come. We live in death's shadows but we are guided by the light of Christ whose death was but a temporary pathway that opened the kingdom of heaven for all who desire what God has promised. Where do we look for God's promise? In both life and in death, God's promise does not fail us. That is a message that is certain for us for it is God's message for you.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia!

A TIME OF SABBATICAL...

Throughout scripture, the people of God take intentional time for rest. Jesus frequently stepped away during his ministry, to quiet places to pray and find renewal. In 2002, in effort to support healthy leaders, Saint Andrew developed a Sabbatical Leave Policy to allow pastors serving at Saint Andrew to take intentional time away as well.

The Sabbatical policy states, "Sabbatical leave is recommended for clergy every so often as a time of renewal for one's professional and personal life. Saint Andrew offers sabbatical to its pastors after having served five years at Saint Andrew or having served six to eight years total time in ministry."

Last fall, Pastor Jenn was nominated by Bishop Jerry Mansholt to participate in a leadership academy for pastors of larger congregations throughout the ELCA. The leadership academy will take place over the course of three intensives—offered in August of this year, February of next year, and August of the following year. In order to take full advantage of this leadership development opportunity, Pastor Jenn and Pastor Craig proposed a time of sabbatical for her to reflect, learn, rest and immerse in this experience as well as expand it into two other opportunities.

The church council has reviewed this plan and has approved the request for Sabbatical to be taken in two parts: August and September of 2017 and portions of January and February 2018, shaped around two of the three intensives. In addition to the leadership intensives, she will travel to Germany to explore the Luther and Reformation sites in this, the 500th anniversary of the Reformation and consider how our own reformation celebration will be shaped. Pastor Jenn will consider how to share this exciting experience at a later date.
