Last Reflections by Pastor Craig

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." - John 14:27

I have often been interested to learn how and when Jesus addressed his followers with the word of *peace*. "*Peace*, be still," as Jesus calmed the storm. "*Peace* be with you," when Jesus met the disciples behind locked doors. When life is uncertain and when fear stirs among us, it is comforting to be reminded that Jesus meets us and offers *peace*.

As I conclude my ministry among you and anticipate a transition into another setting, there is no doubt that there are some uncertainties and perhaps even some fears for what the future looks like as I depart leaving a void in the pastoral leadership at Saint Andrew. Before you let those feelings consume your minds and hearts, I want to encourage you to be at *peace* with one another and to be at *peace* in the life of the church knowing that together we are members of Christ's church and before he left, Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to empower and direct the church from the Day of Pentecost forward. By virtue of our baptism, we are, you and I, spirit-filled and spirit-led people. We are people of hope. We are people with a purpose, to reflect the one in whose image we are made.

Over these nine years, I have shared many memorable ministry experiences with you which will live long in my heart and which bring me great joy to recall. We have worshipped, studied, shared life transitions, prayed, pondered and celebrate the life that was given to us. For all the ways you have shared life with Karen and I, thank you! We leave knowing that we have shared a sense of community and a sense of purpose as a common reflection of life in Christ. We leave with gratitude for your partnership and your witness of faith. We leave but are also glad to be received into another faith community who are just as eager to welcome us as you have done so freely these past years. For the community of Saint Andrew as well as the community of Salem, we are thankful to serve among you.

I do not know what the specifics are about the future. I do not know how my leaving will affect the current and future leadership at Saint Andrew but I do know that Jesus promises to be with us and to shepherd us with love and grace. Jesus promises the gift of the Holy Spirit to call, gather and enlighten the church, to reveal the truth about who God is in our midst and to breath into us new life.

So, dear brothers and sisters, partners in faith and hope, it is my prayer that you continue the work set before you with eagerness, gentleness and hopefulness, knowing that it is a special privilege to participate in this great missional work and that through it all, we have what Jesus promised, his abundant and ever present *peace*.

May the **peace** of God that passes all understanding keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Amen – Proud to be partners with you in the gospel, Pastor Craig

Dumela (Hello)

O tsogile Jang (How are you)? Kna ke tsogike sentle (Myself I am fine). Words have such a powerful meaning and in such a short period of time, my fellow travelers and I have experienced a wonderful, glorious welcoming from our brothers and sisters here in Zeerust, South Africa. First, we must thank everyone back home who supported us for this companionship visit. Your love, prayers and support have made this trip an experience of a lifetime. It has also strengthened the companionship we so desire. Second, we must also thank our sister church and all our host families for embracing us with such open arms and welcoming smiles. To be able to share in God's word in person here has touched each and every one of us in ways we cannot explain.



We have been welcomed here in our sister church with warm embraces, thoughtful & kind words/prayers and want to update everyone on experiences that we have had here in Zeerust. Sharing God's word and prayer in the name of Jesus with our brothers and sisters has been beyond amazing. There are 11 official languages of South Africa. South African English is also different to the English that is used in Australia, England and the United States. English is spoken and understood in all of South African provinces by most of the people. English is taught in most schools and is a prerequisite for taking the high school final exam. As overwhelming as it seemed to us that we would have difficulties communicating with people, we were assured that we would be able to communicate with our brothers and sisters. This was evident as we had welcoming smiles and greetings wherever we went.

Phil and I arrived in Johannesburg on July 6th. Ron, Betty, Jacob and Gabriel had a few minor paperwork issues which delayed their arrival (more details to follow), but everyone arrived safely. Phil and I were transported to Outlook Lodge where we gathered for a wonderfully prepared meal and conversation. We then rested and began our journey to Rustenburg where we were all to gather at the Diocese to be welcomed by Bishop Ubane. Ron, Betty, Jacob and Gabriel arrived later at the diocese to join us in traveling to Zeerust.

So I will stop now and leave you in suspense... hopefully wanting to hear more of our stories as we travel in God's love and join our brothers and sisters of Zeerust. It is our intent that we will get to share all of our wonderful adventures and stories with you as we plan to compile information and pictures in a presentation to share with the congregation at fellowship following worship on *Sunday, August 12 following the 9:30 am* worship service.

"CHRISTIAN ED" AND "FAITH FORMATION" - WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

If you were asked to share the good news of Jesus, what might you say? Where do you feel confident and strong in your faith life? Where could you grow?

"Christian Ed" and "Youth Ministry" is the language Saint Andrew currently uses to describe things like Sunday School, VBS, Confirmation, and other opportunities for connecting young people to faith. While these are good terms, what if we took a larger view at helping people develop and form faith at every stage of life? The church council has commissioned a Faith Formation task force to ask just that question and do some visioning and planning this summer. The taskforce's first goal was to define what is meant by the term *faith formation*. Here is the working definition they came up with. *Faith is formed by...*

Fostering community through connections that create a sense of belonging
Grounded in the love of Jesus
For the purpose of being equipped to share the message of Christ with confidence.
