## CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- Who is someone you look up to? Why?
- Think of someone you think is a "saint." How would you describe what makes them a "saint?"
- Name a person you admire for their faith in Christ. In what ways have they influenced you?

## **DEVOTIONS**

Read: Ephesians 1:11-23.

We can easily think of saints as those who live (or lived) super-Christian lives, people who are heroes of the faith, especially from the past. However, saints are simply those people who have "obtained an inheritance . . . according to the purpose of him [Christ]" (v. 11). In 1 Corinthians 1:2, Paul considered the believers at Corinth "saints," although there were all kinds of conduct that Paul strongly opposed in the church there. We are made saints by the counsel and will of Christ. Ephesians 1:15 commends the church at Ephesus for their faith and love for "all the saints." And this is why Paul gives thanks for this community of believers. It is easy to judge and condemn those around us, but to give thanks for and to bless (Luke 6:20-22) the saints, the church, which is Christ's body, is what we do. The more we—for the sake of Christ—give thanks for our fellow saints, past and present, the more we can move ahead to bless the world with the power of the risen Christ. Who are some of the saints—past and present—who have blessed you and who you want to give thanks for today?

*Pray:* Holy God, as people who are called "saints," give us the faith to offer thanks for those around us called by the will of Christ to live for the praise of your glory. Amen.

# SERVICE

In 2 Corinthians 8:1-7 Paul is speaking about the church in Macedonia. They were going through hard times and not wealthy, but their giving was driven by joy and their praise of Christ's love for them. They were filled with God's grace and gave generously. A Christian response to God's gift of grace is giving. In what ways do you embrace this gift through giving of your time, talents, and treasures?

## **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

All Saints Sunday is a time when we remember those who have gone before us as well as those Christians who surround us in our daily life of faith. It is a day to think about the family of God and our own families who are part of that same faith family. Find a family picture album and tell stories as you look at family and friends. How did they inspire you? What role did they have in your faith journey?
