Network Note from Pastor Jenn

Is it up there? Some other place? Do we fly away above our bodies to meet Jesus? Can our loved ones see us when they have gone before? Martin Luther thought of heaven as part of our existence here and now, in this present life. Since God is omnipresent and everywhere-then God is here and we are with God. In that view, heaven begins in baptism where we are "free from sin and death" by being joined to the death and resurrection of Jesus. In this view we are but a breath away from the saints triumphant-those we love who have died and now live in the fullness of God's presence.

Jürgen Moltmann, a German reformed theologian of the 20th century, thought of heaven as the world's future suggesting that God has granted potentiality for the earth to transform itself. With the state of things politically, environmentally, and even, in our own experiences of brokenness, this one can feel much harder to believe. To quote pop singer Belinda Carlisle circa 1987, will heaven ever be "a place on earth?"

The promise of Heaven is a great comfort because it allows us to hope that our loved ones who have died are no longer in pain, no longer suffering, and no longer weighted down by the anchor of this fragile and frail mortal life. Promised by the resurrection of Jesus, Heaven is present with us now but also not yet fully revealed. For the fullness of heaven, we wait for Christ to come again with hope—and for our own resurrection and the promises of baptism fulfilled in death.

While some have glimpsed heaven in their own near death experiences, for many of us, we rely on the promise of heaven from what the Bible says. We don't know... but we believe. We sense that there is not "nothing" that awaits us. Bur rather, that the "something" God promises is worth the wait.

From the scriptures Christians get four dominant images or symbols of what heaven is like: joyful worship (Rev. 21:21), God's visible presence(1 Cor. 13:12), the garden of paradise where enemies are friends (Luke 23:43), and the new Jerusalem (Rev. 21:1-4). Theologian Ted Peters says this of the new Jerusalem: "When it comes it means salvation: the healing of sorrow, the drying of tears, the forgetting of suffering, and dwelling in safety with God forever."

The first Sunday in November we celebrate "All Saints Day." To quote the communion liturgy, "With the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim... we join their unending hymn" when we come together at the table. The names of those beloved Saints who have gone before us will be printed in the bulletin even as we remember those who have died this year in the faith: Brad, Ross, Peggy, Sherri, Fred, Pam, Sharon, Dan, Bill, Snipe, Beau, Claude, and Barbara. We worship together with them not only on All Saints Sunday, but every single time we worship. The promise is real and is sustaining: Christ gives us life now and forever. Love has conquered death.

FIRST COMMUNION INSTRUCTION

Earlier this year families of 5th grade students were surveyed and a majority of responses indicated that December 8 would be a better time of year to receive first communion.
