Network Note from Pastor Justin

When I was reminded about the Companion Synod Visit meeting last Saturday, I thought, "Great! Saturday was gone and I would have to wait longer to unpack." I grumbled in my heart, but once Tammy Schilling and I arrived at the meeting and began to see the pictures and hear the stories and understand how many years this relationship has been going on, I realized I was wrong to grumble.

Christian fellowship is a radical action in our world. Relationships and bonds build across geographical, cultural, and international divisions witness to the power of faith to uplift the Image of God present within each and every person. It also shows the unity of our faith to draw together and transform a wonderfully diverse group of people through the deceptively simple act of baptism. While it may seem like there are divisions in this country that cannot be overcome, this companion relationship is proof that there is no barrier that cannot be overcome by the Holy Spirit.

Aside from the wonderful witness for Christian unity, to a divisive world, there is the fun of the time together.

We have hosted exchange students for an entire school year through a program called AFS. While I am tempted to lift my family up as proof that anyone can do this if a clergy couple with small children can, I will just say that our girls remember each student and bonded with them in different ways and carry with them a piece of that relationship. This visit is an opportunity to share with your fellow Christians just what you love about the place where God has planted you, the work to which God calls you, and to hear about theirs. While we are journeying though Lent, I encourage you to consider a new path. Prepare for companionship. Challenge yourselves to prepare your summer schedules to help with the visit of our extended family in Christ from Zeerust. Prepare to show them the best that we are at Saint Andrew Lutheran Church, the best that we are as Wisconsinites, and the best that we are as brothers and sisters in Christ to them. They are making a bold step in taking their time, talents, and resources to invest in this relationship because for them, it is worth it. Let us meet their investment with our generosity, the same way that you have been so generous and excited about my presence in the life of Saint Andrew.

My wife may not know it yet, but I hope to have our house prepared so that we can host folks, include them in our lives, and build connections that (via social media and email) will continue to be nurtured. Our girls can share a room again, for a while, they may not know it yet, but I know that when I tell them why, they would be very interested in meeting a new brother or sister in Christ, and be a part of one another's journeys.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

A Little Push (1984)

Vulnerably: Just as Jesus became vulnerable to us, we open ourselves to others.

Empowering: We seek to identify and correct imbalances of power, which may mean recognizing and letting go of our own.

Sustainably: To ensure local ministries last for a long time, we seek to embed mission in ongoing relationships and communities.
