On the Threshold—Pastor Jenn

One of my favorite hymns comes to mind as I think about the new year: *O God Our Help in Ages Past* (ELW 632). Hymn writer Isaac Watts (1674-1748) was dwelling on the text from Psalm 90 when his gift of poetry landed on the blank page before him...

O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home.

Both the words of Psalm 90 and Watts' lyrics are a reminder that God's faithfulness has carried people from age to age —even back to a time before the earth was formed; God was God. And because we can rely on the faithfulness of God, we can find hope for our future, unknown though it may be—that God will be faithful for us, too.

The changing of one year to the next is a good time for self-examination, gratitude, and looking ahead — to take the time to stand in the threshold looking both backward and forward: Who/How have we been? Who/How do we long to be? Since it is true that our history and identity usually inform our choices and decisions for moving forward, it is healthy to pause once in a while and consider God's faithfulness and our own human capacity to change.

These questions "Who/How have I been? Who/How do I long to be?" come to my mind as I prepare to depart for the second half of my sabbatical time away, beginning January 17 and concluding at the end of February. This second and final portion of sabbatical will include time at an intensive leadership training in California, and time between Waukesha (with my family) and Wausau as I use the space to renew through rest, recreation, worship, and study. On the threshold of this opportunity, I continue to be thankful to Saint Andrew for this gift of a season of renewal in my life and in our lives together. Although I will be out of contact and unavailable to provide pastoral care, I would welcome your prayers as you have been and will remain in mine.

Likewise, on the morning of January 28, we will pause as a congregation to consider God's faithfulness in 2017 and how we are called forward in the coming year. Please plan on attending the *congregation annual meeting*—which will take place in the context of worship at 9:30 that morning. Hear how we have brought about God's love within and outside of the walls of Saint Andrew in 2017and then, lend your voice, vote, prayers and praise as we dedicate the coming year of ministry once again to the faithful hands of God... *"our hope for years to come."*
