A letter to God—Pr. Jenn

If you were to write God a letter, what would you say? I was recently invited by a colleague to do that very thing. To sit down, pen to paper, and write to the Lord. I wasn't sure where to begin, so I started with how I was feeling about the way things have been between us... that is, how things have felt between God and me. I wrote about our history. I wrote about my questions. I was surprised to see that the letter eventually turned into what felt like a love letter

This love letter that I was invited to write reminded me that Jesus invited that kind of love toward God when he was asked about the greatest commandment. He responded by saying that the greatest commandment had to do with love—specifically—love of God and love of neighbor. And how does Jesus say we should love God? With all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength.

Loving God with our strength might mean physically coming to worship, to praise God. Loving God with strength might look like doing the heavy lifting of service to our neighbor for the sake of God's love for them. We love God with our minds when we engage God's word with our questions, or when we spend time studying theological concepts relating to God.

But how exactly do we love God, heart and soul? Spiritual practices often help us with that kind of love. When we pray, meditate, sing, read scripture, walk, drive, lay in bed before sleep, or attempt any activity with the outcome of listening for God, we love God heart and soul. Loving God heart and soul is allowing God the time to be present with you, by taking the time to be fully present with God. I was recently asked to consider this set of heart and soul questions. So I will ask them now of you:

How is it with God and me? What is God up to? To what am I being called?

Although our faith is not dependent on feelings, sometimes we long to "feel" the love and presence God promises. But if we only designate one hour each week to feel that presence, then perhaps we miss the chance for a deeper reciprocal relationship with God who offers us so much love, that he offers everything for us. So I would invite you, take the time to write that letter. Talk with God about what's on your heart. Maybe even just start with those three questions... or these two words, "Dear Lord..." In doing so, you may discover something new and surprising about what God has been up to in your life.

SPAGHETTI DINNER FUNDRAISER—ZEERUST TRAVELERS


Sunday, May 6; 10:30 am-1:00 pm; Fellowship Hall

DID YOU KNOW?

If you are over 70 1/2 years old and taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA, you could reduce the taxable portion of your RMD by making a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) to a qualified charitable organization such as Saint Andrew directly from your IRA. Rather than receiving an itemized deduction for your donation, less of your IRA distribution would be taxable. If you are interested in the QCD, contact the church office for more information. Because there are certain restrictions and requirements for QCD, you will need to consult with your financial advisor or institution to set this up.
