In the same breath we petition our God for the strength to hear and to heed the admonitions of the Lord Jesus in today's gospel. Recalling that we have been sealed by the Spirit and sustained by the Savior's body and blood, we keep on keeping on as God gives us breath, to the praise of God's glory.

Pentecost 25— November 11/November 14

The end is near. There is no doubt about it. The warnings are dire. The tone of today's texts is ominous. But the baptized know how to live in the "meantimes." The baptized are strengthened for the living of these days in word and sacrament. The baptized rally around the invitation of the apostle: "Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right."

Zak, age 5, and Callie, 18 months, are the only two kids in the world known to have a specific Chromosome 3 and 6 abnormalities, which causes delays with their cognitive and physical development. The disorder affects the basic structure of their bodies, leading to numerous challenges for the kids. These challenges have made it very difficult on the family to navigate through their own home or to find support groups in their area.

In an effort to help the Teeters, and provide a much needed resource for other special needs families in the Central Wisconsin area, local business River Valley Bank and Channel 9 have teamed up to spearhead 'Build from the Heart' project. The project includes building a new handicap accessible home for the Teeters, which also includes a Community Room for other special needs families to utilize for playgroups, therapy and networking.

Members of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church Ministries are working together to help raise funds for this important project and reach out to one of our families in need.

Many volunteers are needed to help with this benefit. Please call Jeanne Willems at 715-355-1507, if you would like to help.




THANKSGIVING HARVEST ITEMS NEEDED
