PASTORAL REFLECTIONS



Do you know that Saint Andrew has a sister? In an effort to expand the identity of Christ's church throughout the world, partner relationships have been established with Lutheran synods in other parts of the world. The companion synod for the East Central Synod of Wisconsin is the Evangelical Lutheran Church in South Africa. Several years ago, congregations were linked to create more personal relationships with area congregations in our companion synod. The sister congregation for Saint Andrew is Zeerust Lutheran Church. This congregation shares a similar history with Saint Andrew as it is a mission start congregation of 34 years. It began with people meeting in a garage in September of 1997 as a group of Lutherans gathered together to pray and serve the area. Over the course of one year, efforts will be made at Saint Andrew to prepare for a visit from members of Zeerust (summer 2012). There is much we have yet to learn about our sister congregation in anticipation of their visit. Various ministries at Saint Andrew are currently involved in ways to highlight our partnership with this sister congregation. There will be a display in the Fellowship Hall on May 15 and Fair Trade Coffee will be served. Also, a banner representing Saint Andrew will be on display before it is sent to Zeerust as a symbol of our dedication to nurture this new relationship. It is exciting to consider ways this relationship can grow in support and participation as the congregations strive to remain faithful in the mission and ministry of Christ's church in Wisconsin and South Africa.
