PASTORAL REFLECTIONS—*Pastor Jenn*

I was with some friends, barreling through some pretty substantial rapids on a river in West Virginia. Although I had never been rafting before, and had my reservations—I had succumbed to peer pressure and before I knew it—a college student was giving me a crash course in paddles, life jackets, and helmets. Because it had rained, the rapids were higher and more wild than expected. Although things started out smoothly, before we knew it, several of us had been thrown out of the boat and left to our own senses to make our way through the rapids in hopes of being scooped up by the guide. In that moment, I was at the mercy of my circumstance—but after a brief moment in the water, the guide scooped me up and away we went.

In Holy Baptism, we give thanks to God for water and we recount a history of how God has moved in relationship to God's people throughout the ages—from the waters of creation, to the deliverance of Noah and the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan. In the calm and peaceful streams and the raging tumultuous rivers, we can be sure that God is with us as we live into who God has created and called each one of us to be.

On Monday, July 9th I was formally installed as Associate Pastor at Saint Andrew Lutheran Church. I am truly grateful for the graciousness many of you have shared in such a great welcome through your prayers and in person, as well as numerous notes and gifts. I thank God for having been called to be among you in partnership with Pastor Craig and the staff. I am also thankful for how special this time has been with Vacation Bible School and the visit from our companions from Zeerust.

In worship we move our focus to the letter of Ephesians. In this letter we find some major theological themes: the oneness of the church, unity in Christ, and what it means to live out our baptismal callings. Together in the waters we will hear familiar scripture that will guide us to a better understanding of what life “In Christ” is all about. And so, here we go down the river together—trusting in God to guide us.

Mark's gospel makes clear how great was the press of the crowd, with its countless needs to be met, on Jesus and his disciples. Yet in today's gospel Jesus advises his disciples to get away and rest, to take care of themselves. Sometimes we think that when others are in great need we shouldn't think of ourselves at all; but Jesus also honors the caregivers' need. We are sent from Christ's table to care for others and for ourselves.

Thursday, July 26 / Sunday, July 29

This is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied.

The SALC Food pantry currently



SUMMER REFLECTIONS—*Pastor Craig*

"The heat is on!" It has been an unusually warm summer thus far and there is little to indicate it will let up anytime soon. In the past couple of weeks, I have made trips to Appleton and Green Bay and noticed a significant difference in the condition of the crops by the time I got past Stevens Point. The generous rains we received a few weeks ago were not widespread and fizzled out just a little to the south of Wausau. The recent winds have felt less like summer breezes and more like a blast furnace sucking up what little moisture is left to meet the demands of suffering crops. I have learned that in Illinois, farmers are cutting down their corn fields and bailing or chopping the plants for grainless fodder to salvage what they can for livestock. One of my cousins farms the family farm and raises a few cattle of his own. The pasture land he has rented is drying up and he is cutting all the waterways and road ditches he can as hay to feed his herd.

The challenges of life continue on the heels of an economic system that is trying to recover and people who graduate or are in job transition often learn that it takes longer than expected to find work. And yet, we are people of faith. We are children of God whose history is recorded in the scriptures that describe other generations of people who struggled with life challenges and clung to their hope that we know as God's living and sustaining word.

What are the dry places in your lives that long for refreshing and cooling waters of life to restore hope and courage for you? Weekly worship is filled with opportunities to taste and see that the Lord is good and that through Word and Sacraments, we feast on the bread of life and are washed in the waters of Baptism to be renewed and strengthened in our weariness and have our hope and joy restored for the sake of serving as witnesses of God's empowering Spirit in the world.

Twenty-five high school youth and adult chaperones are in New Orleans at the National Youth Gathering. They are with some 33,000 other "citizens with the saints" to worship, learn, witness and serve for the sake of the gospel. Please join me in praying for the time they are away and the experiences that help shape their faith. Many times it seems the heat is turned up and we are challenged by life's circumstances. But even in the challenging times of life, we hold fast to the hope that is ours in Christ Jesus and the ways he unites and empowers us for the sake of equipping us as saints and servants in God's kingdom.
