In addition to all the mailings you receive, two letters were sent from Saint Andrew. I recently gave thought to how I respond when I receive such information in the mail. I begin by sorting the mail into categories. Personal, bills and solicitations. I am quick to open a letter or a card for I know it is personal and it is an extension of a relationship that already exists. Bills do not motivate anything other than a response of a duty or obligation to fulfill and junk mail is unsolicited requests from businesses or organizations that are not concerned about a relationship but are avenues of revenue and income for a cause.

The mailings you received from the church are intended to reflect the first category and to assist in growing in a relationship that already exists. These mailings are intended to remind you that your gifts and participation are important to the ongoing function and mission of Christ's church and that the gifts are part of a relationship we share together.

In a recent article in The Lutheran, Mark Allen Powell of Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Columbus, Ohio is quoted as reflecting on Matthew 6:21, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Powell believes the following is equally true "where you put your treasure is where your heart will *go*." Isn't it true, we will support the things that matter to us, the things that give value and purpose to our lives? Where are your life passions and how do they influence the way you share what is entrusted to you as gifts from God? How does the church nurture and enhance faithful living? Provide worship opportunities centered around word and sacraments? Provide educational and fellowship opportunities? Feed the hungry? Provide comfort to the ill, the lonely, the dying and the grieving? How does the mission of Saint Andrew provide opportunities to be involved and to allow your time, talent and treasures to be literal expressions of Christ's work in the world?

I am hopeful you will sit with the information you received through the two Stewardship mailings and that you prayerfully assess where you put your treasure. In Christ's church there are many ways to share and many ways to participate so that your gifts are accurate reflections of hearts that are molded by the message of the gospel to care and share in the name of Christ. Thank you for the many ways you witness faith and life. Through Christ Jesus we are blessed to be a blessing and to be vessels and instruments of God's grace.

The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love.

2013 SALC PHOTO DIRECTORY


