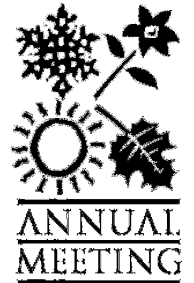

## CURLING AND CONFIRMATION *by Matt Seegert*

Confirmation started this week after a Christmas break and I am very excited to be leading the large group section for this session. We have five weeks to cover the entire New Testament and I won't pretend I wasn't worried about fitting everything in such a short period of time. It got me thinking about what the message really boils down to. What is the essence of the New Testament and our faith journey together?

It might seem a funny place to look for an answer to that question but, as a curler in my third season, I looked to the ice for inspiration. The more I thought about it, the more things I think the winter sport of curling shares in common with our faith and the church.

On a curling rink (team) there are four players. Each player slides two 42-pound stones down the ice with the goal of getting more of their team's stones closer to the center of the target than the stones of the other team. While teammates share this common goal, each player has a different and equally important job to do. Some positions might seem more important than another's but the team's task would be impossible to achieve if every team member didn't fully participate individually. To achieve their goal, communication is key. Each team member needs to know what is going on so they can help get the shots close to the center of the target. Do you see any parallels yet?

While achieving the goal and winning is important, I found that in curling the relationships are more important still. The game is competitive but curling puts more focus on sportsmanship than I have ever seen or experienced in other sports. It is customary to shake hands with **ALL** before the game starts and to wish everyone "Good Curling." During the game it is expected that players call their own faults and congratulate others on well-made shots regardless of which team made the shot. After the game is finished it is tradition to once again shake hands and for both teams to sit together at a table and socialize. That is the spirit of the game and what makes it so unique.

So to answer my own question, I think it's about relationships. It's about our relationship with God and our relationships with each other. That has been and will continue to be the overarching theme for our time together during confirmation. God made a choice to dwell among us and gives us everything to draw us near. God loves us so much that Jesus came to experience life as we do and to teach us how to live in relationship with each other. Then Jesus sacrificed himself and died in our stead and in doing so removed the power of sin and death which is the barrier between us. We are called to live more fully in relationship with God and with each other and we're called to do it together. "Good Curling"!

The life and ministry of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall be open to all who wish to express their faith in God through Jesus Christ by worship, learning, witness and service.
