PASTORAL REFLECTIONS by Pastor Craig

I have long loved the image of the early church where the good of **all** was foundational as a basis for community. "All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people." Acts 2:44-47a

It is an image of cooperation and generous sharing which expresses genuine care for the other and I find is authentic to the message of the gospel. Such communal living exists in various communities, yet today, for the most part, we live more independent from one another rather than united. The recent political showdown is reflective of divisions that are created when opposing views do more to polarize than unite. It is impractical to think we are going to sell our possessions and move in with one another as in a group home community, but there are ways we can reflect the identity we share in Christ to identify and respond to the needs of others.

One way that has recently arisen to assist others is in providing pastoral leadership for a neighboring congregation. Due to a recent health diagnosis, the pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Kronenewetter has taken early retirement. Pastor Frank Connor has served the congregation for several years but needs to focus on taking care of his health issues and step away from his role as pastor. Sharon Fox-Bogen is rostered as an Associate in Ministry and has agreed to provide leadership for the congregation and I have agreed to mentor her and provide pastoral support to the congregation during this transitional time. Practically speaking, this means that Pastor Jenn, Pastor Jeff or I will be at Bethlehem on the first and third Sundays of each month to administer the sacraments and occasionally preach as needed. This does not expand our mission or affect budgetary support, but expands participation to assist with a need of the larger church. I believe this reflects first century ministry and it feels right to reach out to a leader and a congregation with pastoral support.

Are there other ways we can reflect the unity we share as members of the Body of Christ? As we consider the possibilities, I encourage us to hold to the image Paul shares with the Ephesians to "maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace... But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." (from Ephesians 4). May we be so equipped in working together for the sake of serving and witnessing our common faith in Christ Jesus.

WELCOME PRESIDING BISHOP ELIZABETH EATON

During the church wide assembly that took place this past August in Pittsburg, PA—a spirit-filled vote was taken by ecclesial ballot to call Bishop Elizabeth Eaton of the Northeastern Ohio synod into the highest office of our denomination. On October 5 at Rockefeller Memorial Chapel in Chicago, Bishop Eaton was formally installed as the new presiding bishop of the *Evangelical Lutheran Church of America* with more than 1,500 people in attendance. She follows Bishop Mark Hanson who served as presiding bishop for two consecutive terms (in total, 12 years). Presiding Bishop Eaton is the first woman to ever hold this office in the church.
