PASTORAL REFLECTIONS—A GLANCE BACK AND PLANS FOR WHAT IS AHEAD

As another year has come and gone, I find myself in a state of reflection and anticipation. Our younger son, Andy recently turned 30. Earlier this year his wife, Nicole, gave birth to our second grandson. Our older son, Cory was married to a young lady named Kristin this fall further expanding our family. These life events happened with little or even no planning on my part. I am not sure how I feel about the time that has passed and our sons are now grown and in their early stages of building lives with hope and a future. Part of me is very proud and I am enjoying their independence. Part of me is a little sad that a chapter in life has closed and our little boys are now grown men who do not need my permission for their life choices. I am beginning to see my role as a parent differently. Sometimes I feel very confident in that new role and it is very freeing and other times it feels very unfamiliar and I wonder if I am “doing it right.”

There are similarities with my parenting role and how I feel about serving in my role as a pastor. Confirmations students have moved through the program and I wonder what that means for them to stay connected. Couples recently married are having children and need support for parenting and nurturing the faith of the newly baptized. I am interested to plan support for those who grieve, those who enter retirement, whose health is becoming a challenge, the under and un-employed. What is needed to help people plan for various life events and to provide tools that assist in discerning and fulfilling those plans?

As we move into a budget planning and adopting mode, I get a sense that there are many unanswered questions about plans for the future of ministry opportunities through Saint Andrew. Who are being folded in and who are being left out? Words of Jeremiah come to mind. “For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.”

Epiphany is the next season of the church year. It literally means revelation and begins with the news of the birth of the Messiah expanding beyond the surrounding hills of Bethlehem and into the far corners of the world. What are the plans God has for us in the year to come? Where is the message expanding and what are the ways God is inviting and equipping us for the next portion of our journey together?

If we remain rooted in God’s plans, we can proceed into the new year with enthusiasm and great expectation knowing that we are building upon the plans of God’s ever expanding revelation to the world. Thank you for your faithful sharing, planning, participation and support for the generous mission we share through Saint Andrew.

Mission Endowment Fund for Saint Andrew is Coming!

Over the past year, several members of Saint Andrew worked as a task force to consider and develop a Mission Endowment Fund for our congregation. The proposed Mission Statement of the newly developed program is described this way. *"The mission and purpose of the Fund is to provide a process that allows people to give a gift or legacy as a means of extending the mission of Christ's church. The application of the funds received and disbursed will be consistent with the mission and purpose of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church as defined in its Mission Statement."*

It is expected that the fund will enhance the congregational mission apart from the general budget. It is intended to generate an ongoing source of income to expand and continue the vision of stewardship and support. It allows the congregation to respond to important needs and new ventures.

The church council has approved the program and will ask for congregational support to adopt this program at the annual meeting on January 26, 2014. Watch for more information and updates on events that will highlight the fund, it's purpose and how to participate!
