The fourth and final quarter of the daily devotionals, "Christ in our Home" are available and ready to be picked up at the church. I personally find this little resource a daily treasure as I rise to meet each new day. Sometimes the pressures of the day seem heavy and sometimes the day comes with great joy and anticipation. Either way, I am grateful for the gift of another day and the good news that helps define a vision for what God intends. A simple passage of scripture and a brief devotional reflection helps set the tone for the day and reminds me that life is a gift. And what a wonderful gift it is for it is God's gift and the best we can do is share in it and make the most of it. We often take life for granted and likewise the relationships, opportunities, and the resources entrusted to us.

This past year I have experienced a variety of expressions of generosity that remind me that people are eager to participate and share when asked to do so. Your gifts make a difference. Ministry Highlight

FIINANCE/STEWARDSHIP

This ministry guides and informs budgetary decisions on behalf of SALC. Here is a summary of the many different areas involved. **Stewardship**—Develops and carries out the stewardship emphasis throughout the year. Encourages pledging, records giving, and provides quarterly and annual giving statements. **Finance**—Oversees the proper and accurate recording of all financial transactions, and the reporting of the financial condition of SALC to the congregation.

Audit Process—Selects people to audit records and make recommendations for the policies and procedures governing the proper recording of our assets, liabilities, and fund balances. Budget Process—Together with the congregational treasurer, develops and guides the congregational leaders through the annual budget process. The actual to budget results are reported monthly. We prepare the annual budget which becomes part of the congregation's Annual Report.

Endowment Process—Established the bylaws which govern the Endowment Fund. We select caring people that are responsible for the Fund oversight and promotion, and receive reports from the ELCA Fund advisor on a monthly basis. This group also reviews grant requests and selects worthwhile requests to receive funds subject to the bylaws and approval from the Church Council.
