Pr. Jenn-God's Grace Changes Everything!


When I was little, I used to believe that God was "up there" and that we all are "down here." Like good grades in school or the approval of friends, in my little-girl reasoning, it made sense that God's love was something I had to earn, as well.

So I pictured this ladder where each step upward was a kind behavior: mowing Mrs. Koch's lawn, being nice to my brother, cleaning my room. Every step on the ladder would get me closer to being worthy of God's grace. The only problem is that if I did something hurtful, in the image I had created, it would mean I would fall off the ladder and get further and further from God's grace and love. Back at rock bottom!

Then, when I was 14, I began attending St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Waukesha and found myself surrounded by a caring community that not only taught me about grace, but showed grace to me in the midst of life's circumstances. I learned from these people that Jesus Christ is hope for the rock at the bottom. In my own faith formation journey, I learned that Lutheran Christians have a very different understanding of God's grace and it changed my life.

Because of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God experienced a profound understanding of humanity and likewise, we were joined to his very own death and resurrection through baptism. We don't even need to take a step up on to the ladder because God's grace meets us exactly where we are. Then, living in response to that grace, we are able to share in the kingdom of God by living lives of love and service.

"This Changes Everything" was the theme for confirmation camp and is the theme for Vacation Bible School this year. What changes everything?! It's God's grace which comes to us as a gift—free and clear. There is nothing you have to do or be in order to earn or deserve God's grace... on or off the ladder... it is already and always yours. This is the good news of God and we get to be a part of sharing that it does, in fact, change everything!

As we celebrate Independence Day on July 4th, please hold close in thought and prayer our Saint Andrew members; *Phil Bickley, Tammy Schilling, Ron & Betty Dotseth with their grandsons, Jacob and Gabriel*, departing to begin their journey to South Africa. The Lutheran Church of Zeerust is approximately 7500 miles from Wausau and the time change is 7 hours ahead.

Location: South Africa is at the southern tip of the African continent

Area: Slightly less than twice the size of the state of Texas

Climate: Mostly semiarid - subtropical along the east coast, sunny days with cool nights; currently their winter season with temps near 60 degrees

Natural Resources: Gold, chromium, antimony, coal, iron ore, manganese, nickel, phosphates, tin, rare earth elements, uranium, gem diamonds, platinum, copper, vanadium, salt and natural gas

People: (2001 Census)

Ethnic groups - Black African 79%, White 9.6% Multi-racial 8.9%, Indian/Asian 2.5%

<u>Languages</u> - IsiZulu 23.82%, IsiXhosa 17.64%, Afrikaans 13.35%, Sepedi 9.39%, English 8.2%, Setswana 8.2%, Sesotho 7.93%, Xitsonga 4.44%, siSwati 2.66%, Tshivenda 2.28%, isiNdebele 1.59%, other 0.5%

What is commonly shared:

- -Thanks to German missionaries, the Christian faith took hold, grew and prospered in both the United States and South Africa.
- -The Lutheran churches in the United States and South Africa now have excellent seminaries and train our own pastors.
- -Both are surrounded by a rural countryside and have a nearby "mountain". Cows are an important resource for some of our companion congregations as well as for several of our Wisconsin River Valley Conference congregations. Other Madikwe Circuit parishes are in "the Bush" and some of our congregations are in "the Northwoods". Members in our companion congregation of Zeerust are involved in a wide variety of occupations (including agriculture & livestock) just like in the Wausau area.

Thank you to Saint Andrew members, ministry groups and the community who have generously supported the fundraising efforts to generate \$5,355 to assist the SALC travelers with their expenses as they committed to being a part of this special opportunity to expand the connection with our Sister congregation in Zeerust, South Africa. It will be a privilege to hear their stories and learn how Saint Andrew can deepen this relationship established many years ago.

The tentative goals of the task force include:

- Identifying specific ways Saint Andrew can intentionally support its youth and integrate them into the work and life of the church in meaningful ways.
- Identifying specific ways Saint Andrew can intentionally foster intergenerational relationships and a sense of community.
- Identifying specific ways Saint Andrew can intentionally integrate and build awareness of all aspects of the work and life of the church.

Dayna Herold and the pastors will lead this task force which will conclude its work by late summer. Check the Network for future updates and opportunities for listening sessions—or speak with anyone on the task force if you have insights or ideas for how we might approach some of these initial goals with regard to faith formation.
