A word from Pastor Jenn: The Role of Questions

In the gospel passages that were before us last month, Jesus asked many questions: Who do people say that I am? Who do you say that I am? What were you arguing about on the way? Not exclusive to Mark 8 and 9, Jesus is always asking questions—to be precise—307 of them! Questions were central to Jesus' life and teaching. Jesus is also directly asked a lot of questions—183 in total. Here's the interesting thing... he seems to answer only three of the questions he is asked. There is a connection between asking questions and life in Christ.

During this season of life at Saint Andrew, many are wondering... Who will be our next pastor? What does the process look like? What can I do to help? At the encouragement of Bishop Jerry Mansholt, I am sharing responses to a few questions I have been asked to offer some clarity and peace.

- How are you doing? With a very connected staff team, the support from the council and
 many of you, encouragement from colleagues and friends, I am doing well. With the fall
 programing in full swing, it is an expanded schedule as usual, but my work mostly
 remains the same. I am enjoying our ministry here and continue to feel sustained by
 God's spirit. Please know my door continues to be open to provide support, or visit as
 you need.
- Are you leaving, too? The church has always been on the move—typically calling forth and sending out. Jesus designed it that way! Like an inhale and exhale it is natural for clergy to come and go, to and from communities. This is healthy for both pastors and congregations. In Matthew 10:11 Jesus says to the disciples as he sends them out, "Whatever town you enter... stay there until you leave." As of now my intention is to stay here and continue to serve among you as long as the spirit calls us forward.
- Will you now be the Lead Pastor at Saint Andrew? While this is a season of discernment for the congregation of Saint Andrew, it is also personally a season of discernment for me. I have two potential paths forward: remain in my current call of Associate Pastor, or to be considered as a candidate for Lead Pastor. As the process moves forward that was outlined in the letter you recently received, I encourage you to pray for your Pastors, staff, leaders and our congregation as we walk together through this transition.

I am profoundly thankful for the ministry we share. Let's keep asking questions together and listen for God's voice as we wait to see what God has in store!

The life and ministry of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall be open to all who wish to express their faith in God through Jesus Christ by worship, learning, witness and service.

GROWING THROUGH GENEROUSITY

ARE YOU OVER 70?

If you are over 70 1/2 years old and taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA, you could reduce the taxable portion of your RMD by making a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) to a qualified charitable organization such as Saint Andrew directly from your IRA. Rather than receiving an itemized deduction for your donation, less of your IRA distribution would be taxable. If you are interested in the QCD, contact the church office for more information. Because there are certain restrictions and requirements for QCD, you will need to consult with your financial advisor or institution to set this up.
