As we come to the end of February and the season of Epiphany the staff and Altar Guild will be preparing the Sanctuary for the season of Lent. One of their tasks will be to place the Lenten banner before the congregation. The banner announces the Lenten Journey. If you take a moment to view the banner you will see the cross with a crown of thorns. To me, the Lenten banner pictures Jesus' journey to the cross of suffering and death.

Each year the church takes this Lenten journey. You are invited to participate in the Lenten journey this year by attending the soup and sandwich meals and worship services each week. May you discover the ancient experience is really a journey all of us take at specific times in our lives.

This year I would like to suggest that a Lenten journey can be a time of wilderness experiences. What is a wilderness time in our life? A wilderness experience in our life is those places we do not want to go and experiences we would not want to experience. Many of them are centered in the times we feel a loss in our life. This Lent you are invited to read and discover joy, even in a wilderness time through the Lenten book study being offered. More details will be shared in next month's Network and upcoming bulletins.

SOCIAL MINISTRY UPDATE

The Social Ministry works each year to financially support many organizations. Donations are reported to the church council for the annual report, but often times the ministry members are asked how the money is spent. The members are grateful to everyone who support this ministry with donations of time or money. The following is a list of organizations and events the ministry supported in 2018 totaling \$5,640: Saint Andrew Vacation Bible School, Hardel's Hope, Blessings in a Back Pack, Hearts of Hope, Channel 7 Share the Blessings, Peyton's Promise, Mosinee Community of Hope Food Pantry, Faith in Action Hygiene Drive, Sunday Community Dinners, Emergency Food Baskets, Christmas and Easter Food Baskets, the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner, the Neighbor's Place, and the trip to Zeerust, South Africa.

As a part of Social Ministry, a total of \$2,000 of Fair Trade coffee, tea and chocolate was sold in 2018. Fair trade is a foundation whose stated goal is to help producers in developing countries achieve better trading conditions. We are happy to support this foundation. We hope that you share our concern for these organizations, and by knowing what the ministry does, you will continue to support the Social Ministry.
